A BILL

To amend the Federal Meat Inspection Act, the Poultry Products Inspection Act, and the Egg Products Inspection Act to provide that meat, poultry, and egg products containing certain pathogens or contaminants are adulterated, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Pathogen Reduction
5 and Testing Reform Act of 2018”.

1 **SEC. 2. PRODUCTS CONTAINING CERTAIN PATHOGENS OR**
2 **CONTAMINANTS ADULTERATED.**

3 (a) MEAT AND MEAT FOOD PRODUCTS.—Section
4 1(m) of the Federal Meat Inspection Act (21 U.S.C.
5 601(m)) is amended—

6 (1) in paragraph (1)—

7 (A) by inserting “or a microbial pathogen
8 that is associated with serious illness or death”
9 after “which may render it injurious to health”;
10 and

11 (B) by inserting “or such a microbial
12 pathogen” after “added substance”; and

13 (2) in paragraph (2)—

14 (A) by redesignating subparagraphs (B),
15 (C), and (D) as subparagraphs (C), (D), and
16 (E), respectively;

17 (B) by inserting after subparagraph (A)
18 the following new subparagraph:

19 “(B) if it bears or contains a strain of a
20 microbial pathogen, such as *Campylobacter* or
21 *Salmonella*, that is resistant to not fewer than
22 two critically important antibiotics for human
23 medicine (as specified in the World Health Or-
24 ganization’s list of Critically Important Antimi-
25 crobials);”; and

1 (C) in subparagraph (E) (as redesignated
2 by subparagraph (A)) by striking “clause (B),
3 (C), or (D)” and inserting “this subparagraph
4 or subparagraph (C) or (D)”.

5 (b) POULTRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS.—Section
6 4(g) of the Poultry Products Inspection Act (21 U.S.C.
7 453(g)) is amended—

8 (1) in paragraph (1)—

9 (A) by inserting “or a microbial pathogen
10 that is associated with serious illness or death”
11 after “which may render it injurious to health”;
12 and

13 (B) by inserting “or such a microbial
14 pathogen” after “added substance”; and

15 (2) in paragraph (2)—

16 (A) by redesignating subparagraphs (B),
17 (C), and (D) as subparagraphs (C), (D), and
18 (E), respectively;

19 (B) by inserting after subparagraph (A)
20 the following new subparagraph:

21 “(B) if it bears or contains a strain of a
22 microbial pathogen, such as *Campylobacter* or
23 *Salmonella*, that is resistant to not fewer than
24 two critically important antibiotics for human
25 medicine (as specified in the World Health Or-

1 organization’s list of Critically Important Antimi-
2 crobials);”; and

3 (C) in subparagraph (E) (as redesignated
4 by subparagraph (A)) by striking “clause (B),
5 (C), or (D)” and inserting “this subparagraph
6 or subparagraph (C) or (D)”.

7 (c) EGGS AND EGG PRODUCTS.—Section 4(a) of the
8 Egg Products Inspection Act (21 U.S.C. 1033(a)) is
9 amended—

10 (1) in paragraph (1)—

11 (A) by inserting “or a microbial pathogen
12 that is associated with serious illness or death”
13 after “which may render it injurious to health”;
14 and

15 (B) by inserting “or such a microbial
16 pathogen” after “added substance”; and

17 (2) in paragraph (2)—

18 (A) by redesignating subparagraphs (B),
19 (C), and (D) as subparagraphs (C), (D), and
20 (E), respectively;

21 (B) by inserting after subparagraph (A)
22 the following new subparagraph:

23 “(B) if it bears or contains a strain of a
24 microbial pathogen, such as *Campylobacter* or
25 *Salmonella*, that is resistant to not fewer than

1 two critically important antibiotics for human
2 medicine (as specified in the World Health Or-
3 ganization’s list of Critically Important Antimi-
4 crobials);” and

5 (C) in subparagraph (E) (as redesignated
6 by subparagraph (A)) by striking “clause (B),
7 (C), or (D)” and inserting “this subparagraph
8 or subparagraph (C) or (D)”.

9 **SEC. 3. TESTING FOR CERTAIN PATHOGENS OR CONTAMI-**
10 **NANTS REQUIRED.**

11 (a) MEAT AND MEAT FOOD PRODUCTS.—The Fed-
12 eral Meat Inspection Act is amended by inserting after
13 section 9 (21 U.S.C. 609) the following new section:

14 **“SEC. 9A. TESTING FOR CERTAIN PATHOGENS OR CON-**
15 **TAMINANTS REQUIRED.**

16 “Not later than one year after the date of the enact-
17 ment of this section, the Secretary shall, for purposes of
18 examinations or inspections conducted under this Act, es-
19 tablish sampling protocols and testing procedures using
20 the methods and technologies the Secretary determines
21 are most appropriate—

22 “(1) to determine if meat and meat food prod-
23 ucts are adulterated within the meaning of para-
24 graph (1) or (2)(B) of section 1(m); and

1 “(2) to prevent the use in commerce of any
2 product that is determined to be so adulterated.”.

3 (b) POULTRY AND POULTRY PRODUCTS.—The Poul-
4 try Products Inspection Act is amended by inserting after
5 section 8 (21 U.S.C. 457) the following new section:

6 **“SEC. 8A. TESTING FOR CERTAIN PATHOGENS OR CON-**
7 **TAMINANTS REQUIRED.**

8 “Not later than one year after the date of the enact-
9 ment of this section, the Secretary shall, for purposes of
10 examinations or inspections conducted under this Act, es-
11 tablish sampling protocols and testing procedures using
12 the methods and technologies the Secretary determines
13 are most appropriate—

14 “(1) to determine if poultry and poultry prod-
15 ucts are adulterated within the meaning of para-
16 graph (1) or (2)(B) of section 4(g); and

17 “(2) to prevent the entry into or flow or move-
18 ment in commerce of, or the burdening of commerce
19 by, any such product that is determined to be so
20 adulterated.”.

21 (c) EGG AND EGG PRODUCTS.—The Egg Products
22 Inspection Act is amended by inserting after section 7 (21
23 U.S.C. 1036) the following new section:

1 **“SEC. 7A. TESTING FOR CERTAIN PATHOGENS OR CON-**
2 **TAMINANTS REQUIRED.**

3 “Not later than one year after the date of the enact-
4 ment of this section, the Secretary shall, for purposes of
5 examinations or inspections conducted under this Act, es-
6 tablish sampling protocols and testing procedures using
7 the methods and technologies the Secretary determines
8 are most appropriate—

9 “(1) to determine if eggs and egg products are
10 adulterated within the meaning of paragraph (1) or
11 (2)(B) of section 4(a); and

12 “(2) to prevent the entry into or flow or move-
13 ment in commerce of, or the burdening of commerce
14 by, any such product that is determined to be so
15 adulterated.”.

16 **SEC. 4. REGULATIONS; EFFECTIVE DATE.**

17 (a) **REGULATIONS.**—Not later than 18 months after
18 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of
19 Agriculture shall issue regulations to carry out the amend-
20 ments made by this Act.

21 (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendments made by
22 this Act shall apply with respect to meat and meat food
23 products, poultry and poultry products, and eggs and egg
24 products entering into interstate or foreign commerce on
25 or after the date of the enactment of this Act.
