Mr. BURGESS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4566) to amend the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act to provide relief to nonbanks from certain stress test requirements under such Act; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5247) to authorize the use of eligible investigational drugs by eligible patients who have been diagnosed with a stage of a disease or condition in which there is reasonable likelihood that

death will occur within a matter of months, or with another eligible illness, and for other purposes; and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 4566) to amend the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and
4 Consumer Protection Act to provide relief to nonbanks
5 from certain stress test requirements under such Act. All
6 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
7 In lieu of the amendment in the nature of a substitute
8 recommended by the Committee on Financial Services now
9 printed in the bill, an amendment in the nature of a sub-
10 stitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print
11 115-65 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amend-
12 ed, shall be considered as read. All points of order against
13 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The pre-
14 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,
15 as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to
16 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
17 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
18 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Finan-
19 cial Services; (2) the further amendment printed in the
20 report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this reso-
21 lution, if offered by the Member designated in the report,
22 which shall be in order without intervention of any point
23 of order, shall be considered as read, shall be separately

1 debatable for the time specified in the report equally di-
2 vided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
3 and shall not be subject to a demand for a division of the
4 question; and (3) one motion to recommit with or without
5 instructions.

6 SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
7 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 5247)
8 to authorize the use of eligible investigational drugs by
9 eligible patients who have been diagnosed with a stage of
10 a disease or condition in which there is reasonable likeli-
11 hood that death will occur within a matter of months, or
12 with another eligible illness, and for other purposes. All
13 points of order against consideration of the bill are waived.
14 The bill shall be considered as read. All points of order
15 against provisions in the bill are waived. The previous
16 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on
17 any amendment thereto to final passage without inter-
18 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-
19 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
20 member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce; and
21 (2) one motion to recommit.

22 SEC. 3. The requirement of clause 6(a) of rule XIII
23 for a two-thirds vote to consider a report from the Com-
24 mittee on Rules on the same day it is presented to the

1 House is waived with respect to any resolution reported
2 through the legislative day of March 23, 2018.

3 SEC. 4. It shall be in order at any time on the legisla-
4 tive day of March 22, 2018, or March 23, 2018, for the
5 Speaker to entertain motions that the House suspend the
6 rules as though under clause 1 of rule XV. The Speaker
7 or his designee shall consult with the Minority Leader or
8 her designee on the designation of any matter for consid-
9 eration pursuant to this section.

10 SEC. 5. Section 3(a) of House Resolution 5 is amend-
11 ed by striking "the first session of".

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
