Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5515) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2019 for military activities of the Department of Defense and for military construction, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (S. 204) to authorize the use of unapproved medical products by patients diagnosed with a terminal illness in accordance with State law, and for other purposes; and providing for consideration of the bill (S. 2155) to promote economic growth, provide tailored regulatory relief, and enhance consumer protections, and for other purposes.

Mr. BURGESS, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5515) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2019 for military activities of the Department of Defense and for military construction, to prescribe military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (S. 204) to authorize the use of unapproved medical products by patients diagnosed with a terminal illness in accordance with State law,

and for other purposes; and providing for consideration of the bill (S. 2155) to promote economic growth, provide tailored regulatory relief, and enhance consumer protections, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-  
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule  
3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of  
4 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 5515) to authorize appropriations  
6 for fiscal year 2019 for military activities of the Depart-  
7 ment of Defense and for military construction, to prescribe  
8 military personnel strengths for such fiscal year, and for  
9 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-  
10 pensed with. All points of order against consideration of  
11 the bill are waived. General debate shall be confined to  
12 the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and  
13 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
14 the Committee on Armed Services. After general debate  
15 the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-  
16 minute rule. In lieu of the amendment in the nature of  
17 a substitute recommended by the Committee on Armed  
18 Services now printed in the bill, an amendment in the na-  
19 ture of a substitute consisting of the text of Rules Com-  
20 mittee Print 115-70 shall be considered as adopted in the  
21 House and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as  
22 amended, shall be considered as the original bill for the

1 purpose of further amendment under the five-minute rule  
2 and shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
3 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived.

4       SEC. 2. (a) No further amendment to the bill, as  
5 amended, shall be in order except those printed in the re-  
6 port of the Committee on Rules accompanying this resolu-  
7 tion and amendments en bloc described in section 3 of this  
8 resolution. (b) Each further amendment printed in the re-  
9 port of the Committee on Rules shall be considered only  
10 in the order printed in the report, may be offered only  
11 by a Member designated in the report, shall be considered  
12 as read, shall be debatable for the time specified in the  
13 report equally divided and controlled by the proponent and  
14 an opponent, shall not be subject to amendment, and shall  
15 not be subject to a demand for division of the question  
16 in the House or in the Committee of the Whole. (c) All  
17 points of order against the further amendments printed  
18 in the report of the Committee on Rules or amendments  
19 en bloc described in section 3 of this resolution are waived.

20       SEC. 3. It shall be in order at any time for the chair  
21 of the Committee on Armed Services or his designee to  
22 offer amendments en bloc consisting of amendments print-  
23 ed in the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying  
24 this resolution not earlier disposed of. Amendments en  
25 bloc offered pursuant to this section shall be considered

1 as read, shall be debatable for 20 minutes equally divided  
2 and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member  
3 of the Committee on Armed Services or their designees,  
4 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-  
5 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House  
6 or in the Committee of the Whole.

7       SEC. 4. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill  
8 for amendment pursuant to this resolution, the Committee  
9 of the Whole shall rise without motion. No further consid-  
10 eration of the bill shall be in order except pursuant to a  
11 subsequent order of the House.

12       SEC. 5. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
13 in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 204) to au-  
14 thorize the use of unapproved medical products by pa-  
15 tients diagnosed with a terminal illness in accordance with  
16 State law, and for other purposes. All points of order  
17 against consideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall  
18 be considered as read. All points of order against provi-  
19 sions in the bill are waived. The previous question shall  
20 be considered as ordered on the bill and on any amend-  
21 ment thereto to final passage without intervening motion  
22 except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and con-  
23 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the  
24 Committee on Energy and Commerce; and (2) one motion  
25 to recommit.

1        SEC. 6. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
2 in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 2155) to  
3 promote economic growth, provide tailored regulatory re-  
4 lief, and enhance consumer protections, and for other pur-  
5 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill  
6 are waived. The bill shall be considered as read. All points  
7 of order against provisions in the bill are waived. The pre-  
8 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill  
9 and on any amendment thereto to final passage without  
10 intervening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally  
11 divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority  
12 member of the Committee on Financial Services; and (2)  
13 one motion to commit.

14        SEC. 7. Notwithstanding clause 8 of rule XX, further  
15 proceedings on the recorded vote ordered on the question  
16 of reconsideration of the vote on the question of passage  
17 of H.R. 2 may continue to be postponed through the legis-  
18 lative day of Friday, June 22, 2018.

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
