## A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit a foreign official from demanding a bribe, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Foreign Extortion Pre-  
5 vention Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION OF DEMAND FOR BRIBE.**

7 Section 201 of title 18, United States Code is amend-  
8 ed—

9 (1) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the  
10 following:

1           “(4) The term ‘foreign official’ means any offi-  
2 cer or employee—

3           “(A) of a foreign government or any de-  
4 partment, agency, or instrumentality thereof;

5           “(B) of a public international organization;

6 or

7           “(C) any person acting in an official ca-  
8 pacity for or on behalf of any such government  
9 or department, agency, or instrumentality, or  
10 for or on behalf of any such public international  
11 organization.

12           “(5) The term ‘public international organiza-  
13 tion’ means—

14           “(A) an organization that is designated by  
15 Executive order pursuant to section 1 of the  
16 International Organizations Immunities Act (22  
17 U.S.C. 288); or

18           “(B) any other international organization  
19 that is designated by the President by Execu-  
20 tive order for the purposes of this section, effec-  
21 tive as of the date of publication of such order  
22 in the Federal Register”; and

23           (2) by adding at the end the following:

24           “(f) Whoever, being a foreign official or person se-  
25 lected to be a foreign official, otherwise than as provided

1 by law for the proper discharge of official duty, directly  
2 or indirectly, corruptly demands, seeks, receives, accepts,  
3 or agrees to receive or accept anything of value personally  
4 or for any other person or entity, in return for—

5           “(1) being influenced in the performance of any  
6           official act; or

7           “(2) being induced to do or omit to do any act  
8           in violation of the official duty of such official or  
9           person,

10 shall be fined under this title or imprisoned for not more  
11 than two years or both.”.
