Mr. PAUL introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

JOINT RESOLUTION

Relating to the disapproval of the proposed sale to the Government of Qatar of certain defense articles and services.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the issuance of a letter of offer with respect to any
4 of the following proposed sales to the Government of
5 Qatar (described in the certification Transmittal No. 19–
6 14, sent to the Speaker of the House of Representatives
7 and the chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations
8 of the Senate pursuant to section 36(b)(1) of the Arms
9 Export Control Act (22 U.S.C. 2776(b)(1)) on May 13,
10 2019), is hereby prohibited:

1 (1) The proposed sale of twenty-four (24) AH-
2 64E Apache Attack helicopters (Transmittal Num-
3 bered 19–14).

4 (2) The proposed sale of fifty-two (52) T700-
5 GE-701D engines (2 per aircraft, 4 spares) (Trans-
6 mittal Numbered 19–14).

7 (3) The proposed sale of twenty-six (26) AN/
8 ASQ-170 Modernized Target Acquisition and Des-
9 ignation Sight (MTADS) (1 per aircraft, 2 spares)
10 (Transmittal Numbered 19–14).

11 (4) The proposed sale of twenty-six (26) AN/
12 AAQ-11 Modernized Pilot Night Vision Sensors (1
13 per aircraft, 2 spare) (Transmittal Numbered 19-
14 14).

15 (5) The proposed sale of eight (8) AN/APG-78
16 Fire Control Radars (FCR) with Radar Electronics
17 Unit (LONGBOW component) (Transmittal Num-
18 bered 19–14).

19 (6) The proposed sale of eight (8) AN/APR-48
20 Modernized-Radar Frequency Interferometers
21 (MRFI) (Transmittal Numbered 19–14).

22 (7) The proposed sale of twenty-nine (29) AN/
23 AAR-57 Common Missile Warning System (CMWS)
24 (1 per aircraft, 5 spares) (Transmittal Numbered
25 19–14).

1 (8) The proposed sale of fifty-eight (58) Em-
2 bedded Global Positioning Systems with Inertial
3 Navigation (EGI) (2 per aircraft, 10 spares) (Trans-
4 mittal Numbered 19–14).

5 (9) The proposed sale of two thousand five hun-
6 dred (2,500) AGM–114R Hellfire missiles (Trans-
7 mittal Numbered 19–14).

8 (10) The proposed sale of twenty-five (25)
9 Hellfire Captive Air Training Missiles (CATM) (1
10 per aircraft, 1 spare) (Transmittal Numbered 19–
11 14).

12 (11) The proposed sale of twenty-eight (28)
13 M230 30mm automatic chain guns (1 per aircraft,
14 4 spares), AN/AVR–2B laser detecting sets, AN/
15 APR–39 Radar Signal Detecting Sets, AN/AVS–6
16 Night Vision Goggles, M299 Hellfire missile launch-
17 ers, 2.75 inch Hydra Rockets, 30mm cartridges,
18 CCU–44 impulse cartridges, M206 and 211 counter-
19 measure flares, M230 automatic guns and associated
20 components, 2.75 inch rocket launcher tubes, AN/
21 ARC–231 and AN/ARC–201D radios with associ-
22 ated components, AN/APX–123 transponders, image
23 intensifiers, MUMT2i systems, AN/ARN–153 tac-
24 tical airborne navigation systems, chaff, spare and
25 repair parts, support equipment, training and train-

1 ing equipment, U.S. Government and contractor en-
2 gineering, technical, and logistics support services,
3 and other related elements of logistics and program
4 support (Transmittal Numbered 19–14).

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
