2       **SECTION 1. ADJUSTMENT OF AMOUNTS OF COMMITTEE EX-**  
3                       **PENSES FOR THE ONE HUNDRED SEVEN-**  
4                       **TEENTH CONGRESS.**

5           (a) AGGREGATE AMOUNT FOR CONGRESS.—Notwith-  
6 standing section 1(b) of House Resolution 316, the  
7 amount paid out of the applicable accounts of the House  
8 of Representatives with respect to the One Hundred Sev-  
9 enteenth Congress for the expenses (including the ex-

1 penses of all staff salaries) of each committee named in  
2 such section shall be as follows: Committee on Agriculture,
