Ms. SCANLON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5314) to protect our democracy by preventing abuses of presidential power, restoring checks and balances and accountability and transparency in government, and defending elections against foreign interference, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (S. 1605) to designate the National Pulse Memorial located at 1912 South Orange Avenue in Orlando, Florida, and for other purposes; and providing for consideration of the bill (S. 610) to address behavioral health and well-being among health care professionals.

1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 5314) to protect our democracy by preventing abuses of
4 presidential power, restoring checks and balances and ac-
5 countability and transparency in government, and defend-
6 ing elections against foreign interference, and for other
7 purposes. All points of order against consideration of the
8 bill are waived. An amendment in the nature of a sub-
9 stitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print
10 117–20, modified by the amendment printed in part A of
11 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this
12 resolution, shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as
13 amended, shall be considered as read. All points of order
14 against provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The
15 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
16 bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto,
17 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
18 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
19 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Over-
20 sight and Reform or their respective designees; (2) the fur-
21 ther amendments described in section 2 of this resolution;
22 (3) the amendments en bloc described in section 3 of this
23 resolution; and (4) one motion to recommit.

24 SEC. 2. After debate pursuant to the first section of
25 this resolution, each further amendment printed in part

1 B of the report of the Committee on Rules not earlier con-
2 sidered as part of amendments en bloc pursuant to section
3 3 of this resolution shall be considered only in the order
4 printed in the report, may be offered only by a Member
5 designated in the report, shall be considered as read, shall
6 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
7 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
8 may be withdrawn by the proponent at any time before
9 the question is put thereon, shall not be subject to amend-
10 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division
11 of the question.

12 SEC. 3. It shall be in order at any time after debate
13 pursuant to the first section of this resolution for the chair
14 of the Committee on Oversight and Reform or her des-
15 ignee to offer amendments en bloc consisting of further
16 amendments printed in part B of the report of the Com-
17 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution not earlier
18 disposed of. Amendments en bloc offered pursuant to this
19 section shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for
20 20 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair and
21 ranking minority member of the Committee on Oversight
22 and Reform or their respective designees, shall not be sub-
23 ject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand
24 for division of the question.

1 SEC. 4. All points of order against the further amend-
2 ments printed in part B of the report of the Committee
3 on Rules or amendments en bloc described in section 3
4 of this resolution are waived.

5 SEC. 5. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
6 in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 1605) to
7 designate the National Pulse Memorial located at 1912
8 South Orange Avenue in Orlando, Florida, and for other
9 purposes. All points of order against consideration of the
10 bill are waived. An amendment in the nature of a sub-
11 stitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print
12 117-21 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amend-
13 ed, shall be considered as read. All points of order against
14 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The pre-
15 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,
16 as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to
17 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
18 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
19 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Armed
20 Services or their respective designees; and (2) one motion
21 to commit.

22 SEC. 6. The chair of the Committee on Armed Serv-
23 ices may insert in the Congressional Record not later than
24 December 10, 2021, such material as he may deem ex-
25 planatory of S. 1605.

1 SEC. 7. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be
2 in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 610) to ad-
3 dress behavioral health and well-being among health care
4 professionals. All points of order against consideration of
5 the bill are waived. An amendment in the nature of a sub-
6 stitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print
7 117-22 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as amend-
8 ed, shall be considered as read. All points of order against
9 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. The pre-
10 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,
11 as amended, and on any further amendment thereto, to
12 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one
13 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair
14 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways
15 and Means or their respective designees; and (2) one mo-
16 tion to commit.

17 SEC. 8. (a) At any time through the legislative day
18 of Thursday, December 9, 2021, the Speaker may enter-
19 tain motions offered by the Majority Leader or a designee
20 that the House suspend the rules as though under clause
21 1 of rule XV with respect to multiple measures described
22 in subsection (b), and the Chair shall put the question on
23 any such motion without debate or intervening motion.

24 (b) A measure referred to in subsection (a) includes
25 any measure that was the object of a motion to suspend

1 the rules on the legislative day of November 30, 2021, De-
2 cember 1, 2021, or December 8, 2021, in the form as so
3 offered, on which the yeas and nays were ordered and fur-
4 ther proceedings postponed pursuant to clause 8 of rule
5 XX.

6 (c) Upon the offering of a motion pursuant to sub-
7 section (a) concerning multiple measures, the ordering of
8 the yeas and nays on postponed motions to suspend the
9 rules with respect to such measures is vacated to the end
10 that all such motions are considered as withdrawn.

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
