A BILL

To provide that crib bumpers shall be considered banned hazardous products under section 8 of the Consumer Product Safety Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Safe Cribs Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. BANNING OF CRIB BUMPERS.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
3 date of enactment of this Act, crib bumpers, regardless
4 of the date of manufacture, shall be considered a banned
5 hazardous product under section 8 of the Consumer Prod-
6 uct Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2057).

7 (b) CRIB BUMPER DEFINED.—In this section, the
8 term “crib bumper”—

9 (1) means any material that is intended to
10 cover the sides of a crib to prevent injury to any crib
11 occupant from impacts against the side of a crib or
12 to prevent partial or complete access to any openings
13 in the sides of a crib to prevent a crib occupant from
14 getting any part of the body entrapped in any open-
15 ing;

16 (2) includes a padded crib bumper, a supported
17 and unsupported vinyl bumper guard, and vertical
18 crib slat covers; and

19 (3) does not include a non-padded mesh crib
20 liner.

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
