A BILL

To amend the Native American Tourism and Improving Visitor Experience Act to authorize grants to Indian tribes, tribal organizations, and Native Hawaiian organizations, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATIVE AMERICAN TOURISM GRANT PRO-**
4 **GRAMS.**

5 The Native American Tourism and Improving Visitor
6 Experience Act (25 U.S.C. 4351 et seq.) is amended—

7 (1) by redesignating section 6 (25 U.S.C. 4355)

8 as section 7; and

1 (2) by inserting after section 5 (25 U.S.C.
2 4354) the following:

3 **“SEC. 6. NATIVE AMERICAN TOURISM GRANT PROGRAMS.**

4 “(a) BUREAU OF INDIAN AFFAIRS PROGRAM.—The
5 Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs may make grants
6 to Indian tribes and tribal organizations to carry out the
7 purposes of this Act, as described in section 2.

8 “(b) OFFICE OF NATIVE HAWAIIAN RELATIONS.—
9 The Director of the Office of Native Hawaiian Relations
10 may make grants to Native Hawaiian organizations to
11 carry out the purposes of this Act, as described in section
12 2.

13 “(c) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
14 are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary of the
15 Interior to carry out this section such sums as may be
16 necessary.”.
