CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Authorizing the use of the Capitol Grounds for the National Peace Officers Memorial Service and the National Honor Guard and Pipe Band Exhibition.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*

2 *concurring), That*

3 **SECTION 1. USE OF THE CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NA-**

4 **TIONAL PEACE OFFICERS MEMORIAL SERV-**

5 **ICE.**

1 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Grand Lodge of the Fra-
 2 ternal Order of Police and its auxiliary shall be permitted
 3 to sponsor a public event, the 43d Annual National Peace
 4 Officers Memorial Service (in this resolution referred to
 5 as the “Memorial Service”), on the Capitol Grounds, in
 6 order to honor the law enforcement officers who died in
 7 the line of duty during 2023.

8 (b) DATE OF MEMORIAL SERVICE.—The Memorial
 9 Service shall be held on May 15, 2024, or on such other
 10 date as the Speaker of the House of Representatives and
 11 the Committee on Rules and Administration of the Senate
 12 jointly designate, with preparation for the event to begin
 13 on May 10, 2024, and takedown completed on May 16,
 14 2024.

15 **SEC. 2. USE OF THE CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL**
 16 **HONOR GUARD AND PIPE BAND EXHIBITION.**

17 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Grand Lodge of the Fra-
 18 ternal Order of Police and its auxiliary shall be permitted
 19 to sponsor a public event, the National Honor Guard and
 20 Pipe Band Exhibition (in this resolution referred to as the
 21 “Exhibition”), on the Capitol Grounds, in order to allow
 22 law enforcement representatives to exhibit their ability to
 23 demonstrate Honor Guard programs and provide for a
 24 bagpipe exhibition.

1 (b) DATE OF EXHIBITION.—The Exhibition shall be
2 held on May 14, 2024, or on such other date as the Speak-
3 er of the House of Representatives and the Committee on
4 Rules and Administration of the Senate jointly designate.

5 **SEC. 3. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed
7 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
8 Board, the event shall be—

9 (1) free of admission charge and open to the
10 public; and

11 (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of
12 Congress.

13 (b) EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES.—The sponsors of
14 the Memorial Service and Exhibition shall assume full re-
15 sponsibility for all expenses and liabilities incident to all
16 activities associated with the events.

17 **SEC. 4. EVENT PREPARATIONS.**

18 Subject to the approval of the Architect of the Cap-
19 itol, the sponsors referred to in section 3(b) are authorized
20 to erect upon the Capitol Grounds such stage, sound am-
21 plification devices, and other related structures and equip-
22 ment, as may be required for the Memorial Service and
23 Exhibition.
