A BILL

To amend title 49, United States Code, to remove the lifetime exemption from the prohibition on procurement of rolling stock from certain vehicle manufacturers for parties to executed contracts.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Rolling Stock Protec-
5 tion Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REMOVAL OF LIFETIME EXEMPTION FROM PROHI-**
7 **BITION ON PROCUREMENT OF ROLLING**
8 **STOCK FOR PARTIES TO EXECUTED CON-**
9 **TRACTS.**

10 Section 5323(u)(5) of title 49, United State Code, is
11 amended—

12 (1) in subparagraph (B) by striking “Except as
13 provided in subparagraph (C) and for a contract or
14 subcontract that is not described in subparagraph
15 (A)” and inserting “Except as provided in subpara-
16 graph (B)”;

17 (2) in subparagraph (C) by striking “Subpara-
18 graph (B)” and inserting “Subparagraph (A)”;

19 (3) by striking subparagraph (A); and

20 (4) by redesignating subparagraphs (B) and
21 (C) as subparagraphs (A) and (B), respectively.

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
