4	SEC. 2. INADMISSIBILITY AND DEPORTABILITY RELATED

7	(a) Inadmissibility.—Section 212(a)(2) of the Im					
8	migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(2)) is					
9	amended by adding at the end the following:					
10	"(J) Social security fraud or identi-					
11	FICATION DOCUMENT FRAUD.—					
12	"(i) In general.—Any alien who has					
13	been convicted of, who admits having com-					
14	mitted, or who admits committing acts					
15	which constitute the essential elements of a					
16	covered COVID offense, an offense under					
17	section 208 of the Social Security Act (42					
18	U.S.C. 408) (relating to social security ac-					
19	count numbers or social security cards), an					
20	offense under section 1028 of title 18,					
21	United States Code (relating to fraud and					
22	related activity in connection with identi-					
23	fication documents, authentication fea-					
24	tures, and information), or a conspiracy to					
25	commit such an offense, is inadmissible.					

1	"(ii) Covered covid offense.—For
2	purposes of this subparagraph, the term
3	'covered COVID offense' means an offense
4	of fraud pertaining to—
5	"(I) a loan made under—
6	"(aa) paragraph (36) or
7	(37) of subsection (a) of section
8	7 of the Small Business Act (15
9	U.S.C. 636); or
10	"(bb) subsection (b) of such
11	section in response to the
12	COVID-19 pandemic; or
13	"(II) a grant made under—
14	"(aa) section 5003 of the
15	American Rescue Plan Act of
16	2021 (15 U.S.C. 9009e); or
17	"(bb) section 324 of the
18	Economic Aid to Hard-Hit Small
19	Businesses, Nonprofits, and
20	Venues Act (15 U.S.C. 9009a).".
21	(b) Deportability.—Section 237(a)(2) of the Im-
22	migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1227(a)(2)) is
23	amended by adding at the end the following:
24	"(G) Social security fraud or identi-
25	FICATION DOCUMENT FRAUD.—Any alien who

1 has been convicted of, who admits having com-2 mitted, or who admits committing acts which 3 constitute the essential elements of a covered 4 COVID offense (as such term is defined in section 212(a)(2)(J)(ii)), an offense under section 208 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 408) 6 7 (relating to social security account numbers or social security cards), an offense under section 8 9 1028 of title 18, United States Code (relating to fraud and related activity in connection with 10 11 identification documents, authentication fea-12 tures, and information), or a conspiracy to commit such an offense, is deportable.". 13
