Resolved, That the bill from the House of Representatives (H.R. 7213) entitled "An Act to amend the Public Health Service Act to enhance and reauthorize activities and programs relating to autism spectrum disorder, and for other purposes.", do pass with the following

AMENDMENT:

- 14 technologies.
