A BILL

To limit donations made pursuant to settlement agreements to which the United States is a party, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Stop Settlement Slush*
5 *Funds Act of 2023”.*

6 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON DONATIONS MADE PURSUANT TO**
7 **SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS TO WHICH THE**
8 **UNITED STATES IS A PARTY.**

9 (a) *LIMITATION ON REQUIRED DONATIONS.—An offi-*
10 *cial or agent of the Government may not enter into or en-*
11 *force any settlement agreement on behalf of the United*
12 *States directing or providing for a payment to any person*
13 *or entity other than the United States, other than a pay-*
14 *ment that provides restitution for or otherwise directly rem-*
15 *edies actual harm (including to the environment) directly*
16 *and proximately caused by the party making the payment,*
17 *or constitutes payment for services rendered in connection*
18 *with the case.*

19 (b) *PENALTY.—Any official or agent of the Govern-*
20 *ment who violates subsection (a) shall be subject to the same*
21 *penalties that would apply in the case of a violation of sec-*
22 *tion 3302 of title 31, United States Code.*

23 (c) *EFFECTIVE DATE.—Subsections (a) and (b) apply*
24 *only in the case of a settlement agreement entered on or*
25 *after the date of enactment of this Act.*

1 (d) *DEFINITION.*—The term “settlement agreement”
2 means a settlement agreement resolving a civil action or
3 potential civil action.

4 (e) *REPORTS ON SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS.*—

5 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—Not later than at the end of
6 the first fiscal year that begins after the date of enact-
7 ment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the head of
8 each Federal agency shall submit electronically to the
9 Congressional Budget Office a report on each settle-
10 ment agreement entered into by that agency during
11 that fiscal year that directs or provides for a payment
12 to a person or entity other than the United States
13 that is providing restitution for or otherwise directly
14 remedies actual harm (including to the environment)
15 directly and proximately caused by the party making
16 the payment, or that constitutes payment for services
17 rendered in connection with the case, which shall in-
18 clude the parties to each settlement agreement, the
19 source of the settlement funds, and where and how
20 such funds were and will be distributed.

21 (2) *PROHIBITION ON ADDITIONAL FUNDING.*—No
22 additional funds are authorized to be appropriated to
23 carry out this subsection.

1 (3) *SUNSET.*—*This subsection shall cease to be*
2 *effective on the date that is 7 years after the date of*
3 *enactment of this Act.*

4 (f) *ANNUAL AUDIT REQUIREMENT.*—

5 (1) *IN GENERAL.*—*Not later than at the end of*
6 *the first fiscal year that begins after the date of enact-*
7 *ment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the Inspec-*
8 *tor General of each Federal agency shall submit a re-*
9 *port on any settlement agreement entered into in vio-*
10 *lation of this section by that agency to—*

11 (A) *the Committee on the Judiciary, the*
12 *Committee on the Budget, and the Committee on*
13 *Appropriations of the Senate; and*

14 (B) *the Committee on the Judiciary, the*
15 *Committee on the Budget, and the Committee on*
16 *Appropriations of the House of Representatives.*

17 (2) *PROHIBITION ON ADDITIONAL FUNDING.*—*No*
18 *additional funds are authorized to be appropriated to*
19 *carry out this subsection.*

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
