Mr. MASSIE, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 7888) to reform the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 529) to extend the customs waters of the United States from 12 nautical miles to 24 nautical miles from the baselines of the United States, consistent with Presidential Proclamation 7219; providing for consideration of the resolution (H. Res. 1112) denouncing the Biden administration’s immi-

gration policies; and providing for consideration of the resolution (H. Res. 1117) opposing efforts to place one-sided pressure on Israel with respect to Gaza.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-  
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule  
3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of  
4 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 7888) to reform the Foreign Intel-  
6 ligence Surveillance Act of 1978. The first reading of the  
7 bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against  
8 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall  
9 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-  
10 ly divided among and controlled by the chair and ranking  
11 minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary or  
12 their respective designees and the chair and ranking mi-  
13 nority member of the Permanent Select Committee on In-  
14 telligence or their respective designees. After general de-  
15 bate the bill shall be considered for amendment under the  
16 five-minute rule. An amendment in the nature of a sub-  
17 stitute consisting of the text of Rules Committee Print  
18 118–27 shall be considered as adopted. The bill, as  
19 amended, shall be considered as the original bill for the  
20 purpose of further amendment under the five-minute rule  
21 and shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
22 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. No further  
23 amendment to the bill, as amended, shall be in order ex-

1 cept those printed in the report of the Committee on Rules  
2 accompanying this resolution. Each such further amend-  
3 ment may be offered only in the order printed in the re-  
4 port, may be offered only by a Member designated in the  
5 report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for  
6 the time specified in the report equally divided and con-  
7 trolled by the proponent and an opponent, shall not be  
8 subject to amendment, and shall not be subject to a de-  
9 mand for division of the question in the House or in the  
10 Committee of the Whole. All points of order against such  
11 further amendments are waived. At the conclusion of con-  
12 sideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall  
13 rise and report the bill, as amended, to the House with  
14 such further amendments as may have been adopted. The  
15 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the  
16 bill, as amended, and on any further amendment thereto  
17 to final passage without intervening motion except one  
18 motion to recommit.

19       SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
20 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 529) to  
21 extend the customs waters of the United States from 12  
22 nautical miles to 24 nautical miles from the baselines of  
23 the United States, consistent with Presidential Proclama-  
24 tion 7219. All points of order against consideration of the  
25 bill are waived. The amendment in the nature of a sub-

1 stitute recommended by the Committee on Ways and  
2 Means now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopt-  
3 ed. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All  
4 points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended,  
5 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as  
6 ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further  
7 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening  
8 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and  
9 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
10 the Committee on Ways and Means or their respective des-  
11 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

12       SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
13 in order without intervention of any point of order to con-  
14 sider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 1112) denounc-  
15 ing the Biden administration's immigration policies. The  
16 resolution shall be considered as read. The previous ques-  
17 tion shall be considered as ordered on the resolution and  
18 preamble to adoption without intervening motion or de-  
19 mand for division of the question except one hour of de-  
20 bate equally divided and controlled by the chair and rank-  
21 ing minority member of the Committee on the Judiciary  
22 or their respective designees.

23       SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
24 in order without intervention of any point of order to con-  
25 sider in the House the resolution (H. Res. 1117) opposing

1 efforts to place one-sided pressure on Israel with respect  
2 to Gaza. The resolution shall be considered as read. The  
3 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the  
4 resolution and preamble to adoption without intervening  
5 motion or demand for division of the question except one  
6 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair  
7 and ranking minority member of the Committee on For-  
8 eign Affairs or their respective designees.
