Res. 88) providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Education relating to “Improving Income Driven Repayment for the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program and the Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) Program”.

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 4468) to prohibit the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency from finalizing, implementing, or enforcing a proposed rule with respect to emissions from vehicles, and

for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 5933) to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to require additional information in disclosures of foreign gifts and contracts from foreign sources, restrict contracts with certain foreign entities and foreign countries of concern, require certain staff and faculty to report foreign gifts and contracts, and require disclosure of certain foreign investments within endowments; and providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H. J. Res. 88) providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Department of Education relating to “Improving Income Driven Repayment for the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program and the Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) Program”.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.  
3 4468) to prohibit the Administrator of the Environmental  
4 Protection Agency from finalizing, implementing, or en-  
5 forcing a proposed rule with respect to emissions from ve-  
6 hicles, and for other purposes. All points of order against  
7 consideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be con-  
8 sidered as read. All points of order against provisions in  
9 the bill are waived. The previous question shall be consid-  
10 ered as ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto,  
11 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one  
12 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair  
13 and ranking minority member of the Committee on En-  
14 ergy and Commerce or their respective designees; (2) the

1 amendment printed in part A of the report of the Com-  
2 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution, if offered  
3 by the Member designated in the report, which shall be  
4 in order without intervention of any point of order, shall  
5 be considered as read, shall be separately debatable for  
6 the time specified in the report equally divided and con-  
7 trolled by the proponent and an opponent, and shall not  
8 be subject to a demand for division of the question; and  
9 (3) one motion to recommit.

10       SEC. 2. At any time after adoption of this resolution  
11 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,  
12 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the  
13 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration  
14 of the bill (H.R. 5933) to amend the Higher Education  
15 Act of 1965 to require additional information in disclo-  
16 sures of foreign gifts and contracts from foreign sources,  
17 restrict contracts with certain foreign entities and foreign  
18 countries of concern, require certain staff and faculty to  
19 report foreign gifts and contracts, and require disclosure  
20 of certain foreign investments within endowments. The  
21 first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points  
22 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. Gen-  
23 eral debate shall be confined to the bill and shall not ex-  
24 ceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair  
25 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Edu-

1 cation and the Workforce or their respective designees.  
2 After general debate the bill shall be considered for  
3 amendment under the five-minute rule. The amendment  
4 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Com-  
5 mittee on Education and the Workforce now printed in  
6 the bill shall be considered as adopted in the House and  
7 in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as amended, shall  
8 be considered as the original bill for the purpose of further  
9 amendment under the five-minute rule and shall be consid-  
10 ered as read. All points of order against provisions in the  
11 bill, as amended, are waived. No further amendment to  
12 the bill, as amended, shall be in order except those printed  
13 in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-  
14 panying this resolution. Each such further amendment  
15 may be offered only in the order printed in the report,  
16 may be offered only by a Member designated in the report,  
17 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time  
18 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by  
19 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to  
20 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-  
21 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee  
22 of the Whole. All points of order against such further  
23 amendments are waived. At the conclusion of consider-  
24 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise  
25 and report the bill, as amended, to the House with such

1 further amendments as may have been adopted. The pre-  
2 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill,  
3 as amended, and on any further amendment thereto to  
4 final passage without intervening motion except one mo-  
5 tion to recommit.

6       SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
7 in order to consider in the House the joint resolution (H.  
8 J. Res. 88) providing for congressional disapproval under  
9 chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule sub-  
10 mitted by the Department of Education relating to “Im-  
11 proving Income Driven Repayment for the William D.  
12 Ford Federal Direct Loan Program and the Federal Fam-  
13 ily Education Loan (FFEL) Program”. All points of order  
14 against consideration of the joint resolution are waived.  
15 The joint resolution shall be considered as read. All points  
16 of order against provisions in the joint resolution are  
17 waived. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
18 dered on the joint resolution and on any amendment  
19 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except:  
20 (1) one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by  
21 the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee  
22 on Education and the Workforce or their respective des-  
23 ignees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

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
