Mr. RISCH (for himself, Mr. CRAPO, and Ms. LUMMIS) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

A BILL

To provide for determination of the grizzly bear species consistent with the Endangered Species Act of 1973, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Grizzly Bear Review
5 and Resource Restart Act of 2023”.

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 Congress finds that—

8 (1) the entity of grizzly bear (*Ursus arctos*
9 *horribilis*) in the conterminous lower 48 States of

1 the United States, included on the List of Endan-
2 gered and Threatened Wildlife under section
3 17.11(h) of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations (or
4 a successor regulation), is not a species (as defined
5 in section 3 of the Endangered Species Act of 1973
6 (16 U.S.C. 1532)), a threatened species (as defined
7 in that section), an endangered species (as defined
8 in that section), a taxonomic species, a taxonomic
9 subspecies, or a distinct population segment that
10 interbreeds when mature, and should not be subject
11 to the protections of the Endangered Species Act of
12 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.);

13 (2) removal of protections for the entity of griz-
14 zly bear (*Ursus arctos horribilis*) in the
15 conterminous lower 48 States of the United States
16 under the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16
17 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.), when those protections are in-
18 consistent with that Act or otherwise unnecessary,
19 supports prioritization of Federal conservation ac-
20 tions and resources for species in much greater need
21 of protections under that Act; and

22 (3) continuing protections under the Endan-
23 gered Species Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.)
24 for the entity of grizzly bear (*Ursus arctos*
25 *horribilis*) in the conterminous lower 48 States of

1 the United States to not later than the date that is
2 2 years after the date of enactment of this Act pro-
3 vides adequate time for the Secretary of the Interior
4 (referred to in this Act as the “Secretary”) to deter-
5 mine, by regulation promulgated in accordance with
6 section 4(a) of that Act (16 U.S.C. 1533(a)), wheth-
7 er any distinct population segment of grizzly bear
8 that interbreeds when mature is an endangered spe-
9 cies or a threatened species that should be added to
10 the List of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife
11 pursuant to that Act.

12 **SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF GRIZZLY BEAR SPECIES**
13 **UNDER THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT OF**
14 **1973.**

15 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after the
16 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall remove
17 the entity of grizzly bear (*Ursus arctos horribilis*) in the
18 conterminous lower 48 States of the United States and
19 the associated entity of grizzly bear (*Ursus arctos*
20 *horribilis*) in portions of the States of Idaho and Montana
21 listed as an experimental population from the List of En-
22 dangered and Threatened Wildlife under section 17.11(h)
23 of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations (or a successor
24 regulation).

1 (b) EFFECT ON OTHER DETERMINATIONS.—Nothing
2 in this Act limits the ability of the Secretary to make fu-
3 ture determinations of threatened species or endangered
4 species, by regulation promulgated in accordance with sec-
5 tion 4(a) of the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16
6 U.S.C. 1533(a)), for any distinct population segment of
7 brown bear (*Ursus arctos*) that interbreeds when mature,
8 including any distinct population segment of grizzly bear
9 (*Ursus arctos horribilis*) or other brown bear subspecies,
10 subject to the conditions that the Secretary shall not—

11 (1) add any distinct population segment of griz-
12 zly bear (*Ursus arctos horribilis*) to the List of En-
13 dangered and Threatened Wildlife under section
14 17.11(h) of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations (or
15 a successor regulation), unless the Secretary identi-
16 fies objective, measurable criteria that, when met,
17 would result in a determination that the distinct
18 population segment be removed from the list; and

19 (2) be required to designate critical habitat for
20 a distinct population segment of grizzly bear (*Ursus*
21 *arctos horribilis*) described in paragraph (1).

22 (c) DELISTING PROCESS FOR DISTINCT POPULATION
23 SEGMENTS.—If the Secretary identifies a distinct popu-
24 lation segment of grizzly bear (*Ursus arctos horribilis*) in
25 the conterminous lower 48 States of the United States

1 that has met the established recovery criteria for that dis-
2 tinct population segment, the Secretary shall initiate the
3 process to remove that distinct population segment from
4 the List of Endangered and Threatened Wildlife under
5 section 17.11(h) of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations
6 (or a successor regulation).

7 (d) NO JUDICIAL REVIEW.—The removal of the enti-
8 ty of grizzly bear (*Ursus arctos horribilis*) in the
9 conterminous lower 48 States of the United States and
10 the associated entity of grizzly bear (*Ursus arctos*
11 *horribilis*) in portions of the States of Idaho and Montana
12 listed as an experimental population from the List of En-
13 dangered and Threatened Wildlife under section 17.11(h)
14 of title 50, Code of Federal Regulations (or a successor
15 regulation), pursuant to subsection (a) shall not be subject
16 to judicial review.
