A BILL

To prohibit the use of Federal funds to conduct, support, or fund research that studies the effects of gender-related medical treatment, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Terminating Radical
5 Attempts to Negate Sex Through Government Research
6 Act” or the “TRANS Government Research Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON AVAILABILITY OF FEDERAL**
2 **FUNDS FOR CERTAIN RESEARCH.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
4 sion of law, no Federal funds may be made available to
5 directly or indirectly conduct, support, or fund covered re-
6 search.

7 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

8 (1) COVERED RESEARCH.—The term “covered
9 research” means research that studies the effects
10 of—

11 (A) gender-related medical treatment; or

12 (B) any other means of altering the body
13 or physical appearance of a person to no longer
14 correspond to the sex of such person, including
15 by—

16 (i) disrupting the natural development
17 of the body of such person;

18 (ii) inhibiting the natural functions of
19 the body of such person; and

20 (iii) modifying the physical appear-
21 ance or attire of such person.

22 (2) FEMALE.—The term “female” means an in-
23 dividual who, but for a developmental or genetic
24 anomaly or historical accident, naturally has, had,
25 will have, or would have a reproductive system that

1 produces, transports, and utilizes eggs for fertiliza-
2 tion.

3 (3) GENDER-RELATED MEDICAL TREATMENT.—

4 The term “gender-related medical treatment”
5 means—

6 (A) with respect to an individual who is fe-
7 male, medical treatment provided for the pur-
8 pose of addressing the perception of such indi-
9 vidual that such individual is not female, in-
10 cluding—

11 (i) a surgical procedure, including—

12 (I) a vaginectomy;

13 (II) a hysterectomy;

14 (III) an oophorectomy;

15 (IV) the reconstruction of the
16 urethra;

17 (V) a metoidioplasty;

18 (VI) a phalloplasty;

19 (VII) a salpingo-oophorectomy;

20 (VIII) a scrotoplasty;

21 (IX) the implantation of erection
22 or testicular prostheses;

23 (X) a subcutaneous mastectomy;

24 (XI) vocal cord surgery;

25 (XII) pectoral implantation; and

- 1 (XIII) penile transplantation;
2 (ii) an exogenous dose of testosterone
3 or other androgen; and
4 (iii) a puberty blocker, including—
5 (I) a gonadotropin-releasing hor-
6 mone (GnRH) agonist; and
7 (II) a synthetic drug that—
8 (aa) suppresses the produc-
9 tion of estrogen and progester-
10 one; or
11 (bb) delays or suppresses
12 pubertal development; and
13 (B) with respect to an individual who is
14 male, medical treatment provided for the pur-
15 pose of addressing the perception of such indi-
16 vidual that such individual is not male, includ-
17 ing—
18 (i) a surgical procedure, including—
19 (I) a penectomy;
20 (II) an orchiectomy;
21 (III) a vaginoplasty;
22 (IV) a clitoroplasty;
23 (V) a vulvoplasty;
24 (VI) an augmentation
25 mammoplasty;

- 1 (VII) facial feminization surgery;
- 2 (VIII) vocal cord surgery;
- 3 (IX) a chondrolaryngoplasty;
- 4 (X) gluteal augmentation; and
- 5 (XI) uterine transplantation;
- 6 (ii) an exogenous dose of estrogen;
- 7 and
- 8 (iii) a puberty blocker, including—
- 9 (I) a gonadotropin-releasing hor-
- 10 mone (GnRH) agonist; and
- 11 (II) a synthetic drug that—
- 12 (aa) suppresses the produc-
- 13 tion of testosterone; or
- 14 (bb) delays or suppresses
- 15 pubertal development.

16 (4) MALE.—The term “male” means an indi-
17 vidual who, but for a developmental or genetic
18 anomaly or historical accident, naturally has, had,
19 will have, or would have a reproductive system that
20 produces, transports, and utilizes sperm for fertiliza-
21 tion.

22 (5) SEX.—The term “sex” means the biological
23 determination with respect to whether an individual
24 is male or female.

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
