Mr. MCCLINTOCK introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

A BILL

To require the Comptroller General to submit to Congress
a report on grants, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Grant Responsibility
5 and Accountability for Numerical Transparency Reform
6 Act of 2026” or the “GRANT Reform Act of 2026”.

7 **SEC. 2. FEDERAL GRANTS.**

8 (a) ANNUAL GAO REPORT ON FEDERAL GRANTS
9 REQUIRED.—Not later than 6 months after the date of
10 the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the

1 Comptroller General shall make available on a publicly
2 available website and submit to the relevant committees
3 of Congress a report on Federal grants, with respect to
4 the previous fiscal year, that includes the following:

5 (1) The name of, purpose for, and amount of
6 money dispensed for each grant.

7 (2) The name of the entity that received fund-
8 ing for the grant.

9 (3) The name and a description of the project
10 the grant is funding.

11 (b) PROJECT REPORTS FROM GRANT RECIPIENTS
12 REQUIRED.—

13 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 months
14 after the date on which a project is completed, a re-
15 cipient of a Federal grant for that project shall sub-
16 mit to the Comptroller General a report on the fol-
17 lowing:

18 (A) The aggregate amount of Federal
19 funds used for salaries under the grant.

20 (B) The names of and amount of payments
21 to subcontractors.

22 (C) The amount of administrative costs,
23 materials, and any unspent funds.

1 (D) Any other information determined by
2 the Director of the Office of Management and
3 Budget.

4 (2) PENALTY FOR NONCOMPLIANCE.—Any
5 grant recipient that does not comply with paragraph
6 (1) shall not be eligible for a Federal grant until the
7 requirement is met.

8 (3) APPLICABILITY.—This subsection applies
9 with respect to any grant distributed on and after
10 the date of the enactment of this section.

11 (c) GAO ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than 9
12 months after the date of the enactment of this section,
13 and annually thereafter, the Comptroller General shall
14 submit to the relevant committees of Congress a report
15 that compiles the information submitted pursuant to sub-
16 section (b)(1).

17 (d) OMB GUIDANCE.—Not later than 3 months after
18 the date of the enactment of this section, the Director—

19 (1) shall issue guidance on the reports required
20 pursuant to subsections (a), (b), and (c); and

21 (2) shall notify grant recipients of the report
22 requirement described in subsection (b).

23 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1 (1) DIRECTOR.—The term “Director” means
2 the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-
3 et.

4 (2) RELEVANT COMMITTEES OF CONGRESS.—
5 The term “relevant committees of Congress” means
6 the following:

7 (A) Each authorizing committee of the
8 House of Representative and the Senate.

9 (B) The Appropriations Committee of the
10 House of Representative and the Senate.

11 (C) The Committee on the Budget of the
12 House of Representative and the Senate.
