Mr. BURCHETT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Financial Services

A BILL

To prohibit the use of Federal funds for housing assistance for aliens unlawfully present in the United States, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Federal Taxpayer-
5 Funded Housing for Illegal Aliens Act of 2026”.

6 **SEC. 2. FUNDING PROHIBITION.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—No Federal funds may be used
8 to provide covered housing assistance to an alien unlaw-
9 fully present in the United States.

1 (b) EXCEPTIONS.—The prohibition described under
2 subsection (a) shall not apply with respect to—

3 (1) the enforcement of the immigration laws (as
4 such term is defined under section 101(a) of the Im-
5 migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101(a)));
6 or

7 (2) the enforcement of any criminal laws.

8 (c) REQUIREMENTS.—The head of each Federal
9 agency shall take any action necessary to ensure compli-
10 ance with subsection (a) and enforce any violation thereof,
11 including—

12 (1) requiring any recipient of Federal funds to
13 certify that any use of such funds will comply with
14 subsection (a);

15 (2) monitoring compliance with subsection (a);

16 (3) civil penalties; or

17 (4) implementing a period of ineligibility for
18 any recipient of Federal funds following a violation
19 of subsection (a).

20 (d) COVERED HOUSING ASSISTANCE.—In this sec-
21 tion the term “covered housing assistance” includes—

22 (1) rental assistance, including—

23 (A) security deposits;

24 (B) initial rental payments;

25 (C) rental arrears;

1 (D) application fees; or

2 (E) any other cost associated with obtain-
3 ing or maintaining rental housing.

4 (2) housing vouchers;

5 (3) mortgage assistance;

6 (4) utility assistance related to obtaining or
7 maintaining housing;

8 (5) hotel or motel accommodations;

9 (6) emergency, temporary, transition, or perma-
10 nent housing accommodations;

11 (7) stabilization services, including—

12 (A) searching for housing;

13 (B) housing placement;

14 (C) relocation;

15 (D) eviction prevention;

16 (E) landlord mediation;

17 (F) housing-retention assistance;

18 (G) housing counseling;

19 (H) case management services; or

20 (I) any other service with the primary pur-
21 pose of helping an individual maintain housing;

22 and

- 1 (8) any administrative or indirect costs related
- 2 to providing the assistance described in paragraphs
- 3 (1) through (8).
