Mr. GILL of Texas (for himself, Mr. FINE, Ms. BOEBERT, Mr. SELF, Mr. MOORE of Alabama, Mr. PERRY, and Mr. NORMAN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Agriculture

A BILL

To amend the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 to abolish the restaurant meals program under the supplemental nutrition assistance program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Ending Restaurant
5 Purchases with SNAP Act of 2026”.

6 **SEC. 2. AMENDMENTS.**

7 The Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2011
8 et seq.) is amended—

9 (1) in section 3(k)—

1 (A) in paragraph (3), by striking “private
2 establishments that contract with the appro-
3 priate agency of the State to offer meals for
4 such persons at concessional prices subject to
5 section 9(h),”;

6 (B) in paragraph (4), by striking “or by a
7 private establishment that contracts with the
8 appropriate State agency to perform such serv-
9 ices at concessional prices subject to section
10 9(h),”; and

11 (C) in paragraph (9), by striking “and by
12 private establishments that contract with the
13 appropriate agency of the State to offer meals
14 for such individuals at concessional prices sub-
15 ject to section 9(h)”;

16 (2) in section 7(f)(2)—

17 (A) in subparagraph (A), by striking “(in-
18 cluding restaurants participating in a State op-
19 tion restaurant program intended to serve the
20 elderly, disabled, and homeless)”;

21 (B) in subparagraph (B)(ii), by striking “,
22 other than restaurants participating in a State
23 option restaurant program”;

24 (3) in section 9—

25 (A) by striking subsection (h); and

1 (B) by redesignating subsections (i) and (j)
2 as subsections (h) and (i), respectively; and
3 (4) in section 11(e)—
4 (A) by striking paragraph (25); and
5 (B) by redesignating paragraph (26) as
6 paragraph (25).

7 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

8 This Act and the amendments made by this Act shall
9 take effect 180 days after the date of the enactment of
10 this Act.

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
