A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to establish procedures for consistency of certain disaster loan outreach materials, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Disaster Loan Out-
5 reach Consistency Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROCEDURES FOR CONSISTENCY OF DISASTER AS-**
7 **SISTANCE OUTREACH MATERIALS.**

8 (a) OUTREACH MATERIALS.—Not later than 180
9 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Ad-

1 administrator of the Small Business Administration shall es-
2 tablish procedures to ensure that outreach materials, in-
3 cluding any press releases and fact sheets, prepared by
4 each disaster field operations center of the Administration
5 consistently include accurate and current information re-
6 garding—

7 (1) the terms of the disaster loan program car-
8 ried out under section 7(b) of the Small Business
9 Act (15 U.S.C. 636(b));

10 (2) any applicable changes to Federal disaster
11 assistance eligibility processes relevant to applicants
12 for such disaster loan program; and

13 (3) such additional information, as determined
14 by the Administrator.

15 (b) PROCEDURES.—The procedures established
16 under subsection (a) shall include—

17 (1) standardized templates for outreach mate-
18 rials;

19 (2) a process to verify, before public release,
20 that outreach materials use the current templates
21 and reflect current terms and eligibility processes for
22 the disaster loan program;

23 (3) a review process to ensure consistency in
24 outreach materials and templates across disaster
25 field operations centers, where such review occurs

1 annually and immediately after any significant
2 changes to such procedures; and

3 (4) such additional procedures, as determined
4 by the Administrator.

5 (c) NOTIFICATION.—Not later than 30 days after es-
6 tablishing or making significant changes to the procedures
7 described in subsection (b), the Administrator shall submit
8 to the Committee on Small Business of the House of Rep-
9 resentatives and the Committee on Small Business and
10 Entrepreneurship of the Senate a notice of such establish-
11 ment.

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
