## A BILL

To provide that the Federal Reports Elimination and Sunset Act of 1995 does not apply to certain reports required to be submitted by the Tennessee Valley Authority, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Tennessee Valley Au-  
5 thority Salary Transparency Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. SALARY DISCLOSURE; EXCEPTION TO REPORT**  
 2 **ELIMINATION.**

3 Section 9 of the Tennessee Valley Authority Act of  
 4 1933 (16 U.S.C. 831h) is amended—

5 (1) in subsection (a), by striking “a financial  
 6 statement” and all that follows through “\$1,500 a  
 7 year” and inserting “a report of the total number of  
 8 employees at the management level or above, to in-  
 9 clude all executives and board members, that shall  
 10 include the names, salaries, and duties of such em-  
 11 ployees, that are receiving compensation at or great-  
 12 er than the maximum rate of basic pay for grade  
 13 GS–15 of the General Schedule”;

14 (2) by striking all that precedes “The Board  
 15 shall” and inserting the following:

16 **“SEC. 9. FINANCIAL REPORTING.**

17 **“(a) REPORT ON COMPENSATION.—**

18 **“(1) IN GENERAL.—”**; and

19 (3) in subsection (a), by adding at the end the  
 20 following:

21 **“(2) EXEMPTION.—**The information concerning  
 22 salaries of employees of the Corporation contained  
 23 in, or filed with, the report described in paragraph  
 24 (1) is exempt from—

25 **“(A) disclosure under section 552(b)(3) of**  
 26 **title 5, United States Code; and**

1                   “(B) the requirements of the Access to  
2                   Congressionally Mandated Reports Act (Public  
3                   Law 117–263).”.
