A BILL

To provide for an extension of the legislative authority of the National Emergency Medical Services Memorial Foundation to establish a commemorative work in the District of Columbia and its environs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “National Emergency*
5 *Medical Services Memorial Extension Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY FOR ME-**
7 **MORIAL ESTABLISHMENT.**

8 *Section 1(b) of Public Law 115–275 is amended by*
9 *striking the period at the end and inserting “, except that*
10 *any reference in section 8903(e) of that chapter to the expi-*
11 *ration at the end of or extension beyond a seven-year period*
12 *shall be considered to be a reference to an expiration on*
13 *or extension beyond the date that is 7 years after the date*
14 *of enactment of the National Emergency Medical Services*
15 *Memorial Extension Act.”.*
