## AN ACT

To require a strategy to oppose foreign assistance by foreign countries and nongovernmental organizations to the Taliban, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

### SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This	Act	may	be	cited	as	the	"No	Tax	Dollars	for

- 4 SEC. 2. STRATEGY TO OPPOSE FOREIGN ASSISTANCE BY
- 5 FOREIGN COUNTRIES AND NONGOVERN-
- 6 MENTAL ORGANIZATIONS TO THE TALIBAN.
- 7 (a) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—It is the policy of the
- 8 United States—
- 9 (1) to oppose the provision of foreign assistance
- by foreign countries and nongovernmental organiza-
- tions to the Taliban, particularly those countries and
- organizations that receive United States-provided
- foreign assistance; and
- 14 (2) to review United States-provided foreign as-
- sistance to such foreign countries and nongovern-
- mental organizations that have provided foreign as-
- 17 sistance to the Taliban.
- 18 (b) Report.—Not later than 180 days after the date
- 19 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall
- 20 submit to the appropriate congressional committees a re-
- 21 port identifying, to the extent possible—
- 22 (1) foreign countries and nongovernmental or-
- ganizations that have provided foreign assistance to
- 24 the Taliban, including—

- 1 (A) the amount of United States-provided 2 foreign assistance each country or organization 3 receives, if any;
  - (B) the amount of foreign assistance each country or organization has provided to the Taliban; and
  - (C) a description of how the Taliban has utilized such foreign assistance; and
  - (2) efforts the United States has taken since August 2021 to oppose foreign countries and non-governmental organizations from providing foreign assistance to the Taliban, particularly those foreign countries and organizations that receive United States-provided foreign assistance.

### (c) Strategy and Reports.—

(1) In General.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall develop and implement a strategy to discourage foreign countries and nongovernmental organizations from providing foreign assistance to the Taliban. The strategy shall include efforts to support Afghan women and girls who are suffering under Taliban edicts, in a way that does not support the Taliban, and efforts to relocate eligible, fully vetted, at-risk Afghans and Afghan allies

located inside and outside of Afghanistan to the
United States or third countries.

### (2) Reports.—

- (A) Initial report.—Not later than the date on which the strategy required by paragraph (1) is completed, the Secretary of State shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report detailing the strategy and a plan for its implementation.
- (B) Subsequent reports.—Not later than 180 days after the date on which the strategy required by paragraph (1) is completed, and every 180 days thereafter for 5 years, the Secretary of State shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report on the implementation of the strategy, including the impact of the strategy in discouraging foreign countries and nongovernmental organizations from providing financial or material support to the Taliban.

### (C) Additional report.—

(i) In General.—Not later than 30 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit to the appropriate congressional com-

13	the rationale for any changes made
14	since September 1, 2021.
15	(II) An identification of members
16	of the Haqqani Network who are Spe-
17	cially Designated Global Terrorists
18	and the status of the designation of
19	the Haqqani Network as a foreign ter-
20	rorist organization.
21	(III) A description of any United
22	States Government engagements with
23	Sirajuddin Haqqani, Abdul Aziz
24	Haqqani, Yahya Haqqani, or the

1	Haqqani Network since September 1,
2	2021.
3	(IV) Whether new information
4	has emerged relating to the involve-
5	ment of the Haqqani Network in ter-
6	rorist attacks targeting the United
7	States Military or United States civil-
8	ians.
9	(iii) FORM.—The report required by
10	this subparagraph shall be submitted in
11	unclassified form but may include a classi-
12	fied annex.
13	SEC. 3. REPORT ON DIRECT CASH ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS
14	IN AFGHANISTAN.
15	(a) In General.—Not later than 90 days after the
16	date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State
17	shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees
