A BILL

To prohibit the Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration from accepting warrants for the arrest of aliens as valid proof of identification at aviation security checkpoints, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Crime Doesn’t Fly Act
5 of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION OF USE OF ICE ARREST WARRANTS**
2 **AS IDENTIFICATION AT AVIATION SECURITY**
3 **CHECKPOINTS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection
5 (b), the Administrator of the Transportation Security Ad-
6 ministration may not accept a prohibited document as
7 valid proof of identification at an aviation security check-
8 point.

9 (b) EXCEPTION.—Subsection (a) shall not apply with
10 respect to an alien who is being removed from the United
11 States in accordance with the immigration laws (as such
12 term is defined in section 101 of the Immigration and Na-
13 tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101)).

14 (c) PROHIBITED DOCUMENT DEFINED.—In this sec-
15 tion, the term “prohibited document” means any of the
16 following:

17 (1) Immigration and Customs Enforcement
18 Form I–200, Warrant for Arrest of Alien (or any
19 successor form).

20 (2) Immigration and Customs Enforcement
21 Form I–205, Warrant of Removal/Deportation (or
22 any successor form).
