A BILL

To prohibit Federal funds from being obligated or expended to procure certain emergency response maps, direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to develop a strategy to procure and distribute certain emergency response maps, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Uniform School Map-
5 ping Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. FUNDING PROHIBITION AND STRATEGY WITH RE-**
2 **SPECT TO CERTAIN EMERGENCY RESPONSE**
3 **MAPS.**

4 (a) FUNDING PROHIBITION.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
6 graph (2), Federal funds made available for fiscal
7 year 2026 or any fiscal year thereafter may not be
8 obligated or expended to procure an emergency re-
9 sponse map.

10 (2) EXCEPTION.—Paragraph (1) shall not
11 apply to an emergency response map that satisfies
12 the following requirements:

13 (A) Is in a digital file format accessible
14 through a standard or open-source file reader
15 or image viewer on a laptop computer, tablet
16 computer, smartphone, or other mobile plat-
17 form.

18 (B) Is not stored in a data center outside
19 of the United States.

20 (C) Integrates with software utilized by
21 any covered public safety agency that serves the
22 site, or portion thereof, for which such map is
23 procured.

24 (D) Can be printed and shared electroni-
25 cally.

1 (E) Displays information oriented true
2 north and on a coordinate grid.

3 (F) Displays any floor of such site or such
4 portion through overlaid, aerial imagery.

5 (G) Labels any of the following features of
6 such site or such portion, as applicable:

7 (i) An access control point.

8 (ii) A central utility control or build-
9 ing automation system.

10 (iii) A courtyard, park, or field.

11 (iv) An exterior door.

12 (v) A hallway.

13 (vi) A hazard.

14 (vii) A key box.

15 (viii) A parking area.

16 (ix) A road, or other structure, that
17 immediately surrounds such site or such
18 portion.

19 (x) A room.

20 (xi) A stairwell.

21 (xii) A trauma kit.

22 (H) Has been verified for accuracy by a
23 walkthrough inspection of such site or such por-
24 tion.

25 (I) Can be updated.

1 (J) After any funds to procure such map
2 are expended, is made available to the following
3 without a subscription fee or other restriction:

4 (i) The procurer of such map.

5 (ii) Each such public safety agency.

6 (b) STRATEGY.—

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year
8 after the date of the enactment of this section, the
9 Secretary, in consultation with the heads of relevant
10 Federal agencies and departments, shall submit to
11 the appropriate congressional committees a strategy
12 for the Federal Government to carry out the fol-
13 lowing:

14 (A) Procure an emergency response map
15 that satisfies the requirements described in sub-
16 section (a)(2) for any site that is owned or
17 leased by the Federal Government and deter-
18 mined to be critical by the Secretary.

19 (B) Distribute such map to each covered
20 public safety agency that serves such site.

21 (2) BRIEFING.—Not later than 180 days after
22 the date on which the Secretary submits the strategy
23 pursuant to paragraph (1), the Secretary shall brief
24 the appropriate congressional committees on such
25 strategy.

1 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

2 (1) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMIT-
3 TEES.—The term “appropriate congressional com-
4 mittees” means the following:

5 (A) The Committee on Homeland Security
6 of the House of Representatives.

7 (B) The Committee on Homeland Security
8 and Governmental Affairs of the Senate.

9 (C) The Committee on Appropriations of
10 the House of Representatives.

11 (D) The Committee on Appropriations of
12 the Senate.

13 (2) COVERED PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCY.—The
14 term “covered public safety agency” means a public
15 safety agency of the Federal Government or a SLTT
16 entity (as such term is defined in section 2200 of
17 the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 650)).

18 (3) EMERGENCY RESPONSE MAP.—The term
19 “emergency response map” means a map of a site,
20 or portion thereof, to be utilized by a covered public
21 safety agency in responding to an emergency at such
22 site or such portion.

23 (4) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
24 the Secretary of Homeland Security, acting through

1 the Director of the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure
2 Security Agency.

3 (5) SITE.—The term “site” means a building,
4 campus, or facility.

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
