- 5 SEC. 2. ENHANCING THE OPERATIONS OF U.S. CUSTOMS
- 6 AND BORDER PROTECTION IN FOREIGN
- 7 **COUNTRIES.**
- 8 Section 411(f) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002
- 9 (6 U.S.C. 211(f)) is amended—
- 10 (1) by redesignating paragraph (4) as para-
- 11 graph (5); and
- 12 (2) by inserting after paragraph (3) the fol-
- lowing new paragraph:
- 14 "(4) PERMISSIBLE ACTIVITIES.—
- 15 "(A) IN GENERAL.—Employees of U.S.
- 16 Customs and Border Protection designated with
- the authorities granted to officers and agents of
- 18 Air and Marine Operations may provide the
- support described in subparagraph (B) to the
- 20 government of a foreign country, including by
- 21 conducting joint operations with appropriate
- 22 government officials within the territory of such
- country, if an arrangement has been entered
- into between the Government of the United
- States and the government of such country that
- permits such support.

1	"(B) Support described.—
2	"(i) In general.—The support de-
3	scribed in this subparagraph is support for
4	the following:
5	"(I) The monitoring, locating,
6	tracking, and deterrence of the fol-
7	lowing:
8	"(aa) Illegal drugs to the
9	United States.
10	"(bb) The illicit smuggling
11	of persons and goods into the
12	United States.
13	"(cc) Terrorist threats to
14	the United States.
15	"(dd) Other threats to the
16	security or economy of the
17	United States.
18	"(II) Emergency humanitarian
19	efforts.
20	"(III) Law enforcement capacity-
21	building efforts.
22	"(ii) Definition.—In this subpara-
23	graph, the term 'emergency humanitarian
24	efforts' means activities carried out by
25	U.S. Customs and Border Protection per-

1	taining to search and rescue activities,
2	medical assistance, air traffic control as-
3	sistance, and transport necessary to ac-
4	complish such purposes.
5	"(C) PAYMENT OF CLAIMS.—
6	"(i) In general.—Subject to clauses
7	(ii) and (iv), the Secretary may expend
8	funds that have been appropriated or oth-
9	erwise made available for the operating ex-
10	penses of the Department to pay claims for
11	money damages against the United States,
12	in accordance with the first paragraph of
13	section 2672 of title 28, United States
14	Code, which arise in a foreign country in
15	connection with U.S. Customs and Border
16	Protection operations in such country.
17	"(ii) Submission deadline.—A
18	claim may be allowed under clause (i) only
19	if such claim is presented not later than
20	two years after the date of the incident
21	that gives rise to such claim.
22	"(iii) Report.—Not later than 90
23	days after the date on which the expendi-
24	ture authority under clause (i) expires pur-

suant to clause (iv), the Secretary shall

1	submit to the Committee on Homeland Se-
2	curity of the House of Representatives and
3	the Committee on Homeland Security and
4	Governmental Affairs of the Senate a re-
5	port that describes, for each of the pay-
6	ments made pursuant to such clause (i),
7	the following:
8	"(I) The person or entity that re-
9	ceived such payment.
10	"(II) The amount paid to such
11	person or entity.
12	"(III) The country in which such
13	person or entity resides or has its
14	principal place of business.
15	"(IV) A detailed account of the
16	circumstances to justify such pay-
17	ment.
18	"(iv) Sunset.—The expenditure au-
19	thority under clause (i) shall expire on the

date that is five years after the date of the enactment of this subparagraph.".
