To reauthorize the Young Women's Breast Health Education
and Awareness Requires Learning Young Act of 2009.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 ***TITLE I—EARLY ACT***
4 ***REAUTHORIZATION***

5 ***SEC. 101. SHORT TITLE.***

6 *This title may be cited as the “EARLY Act Reauthor-*
7 *ization of 2025”.*

8 ***SEC. 102. REAUTHORIZATION OF THE YOUNG WOMEN’S***
9 ***BREAST HEALTH EDUCATION AND AWARE-***
10 ***NESS REQUIRES LEARNING YOUNG ACT OF***
11 ***2009.***

12 *Section 399NN(h) of the Public Health Service Act (42*
13 *U.S.C. 280m(h)) is amended by striking “2026” and insert-*
14 *ing “2031”.*

15 ***TITLE II—SCREENS FOR CANCER***
16 ***ACT***

17 ***SEC. 201. SHORT TITLE.***

18 *This title may be cited as the “Screening for Commu-*
19 *nities to Receive Early and Equitable Needed Services for*
20 *Cancer Act of 2025” or the “SCREENS for Cancer Act of*
21 *2025”.*

1 **SEC. 202. NATIONAL BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER EARLY**
 2 **DETECTION PROGRAM.**

3 (a) NATIONAL BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER EARLY
 4 DETECTION PROGRAM.—Title XV of the Public Health
 5 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300k et seq.) is amended—

6 (1) in section 1501 (42 U.S.C. 300k)—

7 (A) in subsection (a)—

8 (i) in paragraph (2), by striking “the
 9 provision of appropriate follow-up services
 10 and support services such as case manage-
 11 ment” and inserting “that appropriate fol-
 12 low-up services are provided”;

13 (ii) in paragraph (3), by striking
 14 “programs for the detection and control”
 15 and inserting “programs for the prevention,
 16 detection, and control”;

17 (iii) in paragraph (4), by striking “the
 18 detection and control” and inserting “the
 19 prevention, detection, and control”;

20 (iv) in paragraph (5)—

21 (I) by striking “monitor” and in-
 22 serting “ensure”; and

23 (II) by striking “; and” and in-
 24 serting a semicolon;

25 (v) by redesignating paragraph (6) as
 26 paragraph (9);

1 (vi) by inserting after paragraph (5)
2 the following:

3 “(6) to enhance appropriate support activities to
4 increase breast and cervical cancer screenings, such as
5 navigation of health care services, implementation of
6 evidence-based or evidence-informed strategies to in-
7 crease breast and cervical cancer screening in health
8 care settings, and facilitation of access to health care
9 settings;

10 “(7) to reduce disparities in breast and cervical
11 cancer incidence, morbidity, and mortality, including
12 in populations with higher than average rates;

13 “(8) to improve access to breast and cervical
14 cancer screening and diagnostic services and reduce
15 related barriers, including factors that relate to nega-
16 tive health outcomes; and”; and

17 (vii) in paragraph (9), as so redesign-
18 ated, by striking “through (5)” and insert-
19 ing “through (8)”; and

20 (B) by striking subsection (d);

21 (2) in section 1503 (42 U.S.C. 300m)—

22 (A) in subsection (a)—

23 (i) in paragraph (1), by striking “that,
24 initially” and all that follows through the
25 semicolon and inserting “that appropriate

1 *breast and cervical cancer screening and di-*
2 *agnostic services are provided consistent*
3 *with relevant evidence-based recommenda-*
4 *tions; and”;*

5 *(ii) by striking paragraphs (2) and*
6 *(4);*

7 *(iii) by redesignating paragraph (3) as*
8 *paragraph (2); and*

9 *(iv) in paragraph (2), as so redesign-*
10 *ated, by striking “; and” and inserting a*
11 *period; and*

12 *(B) by striking subsection (d);*

13 *(3) in section 1508(b) (42 U.S.C. 300n–4(b))—*

14 *(A) by striking “1 year after the date of the*
15 *enactment of the National Breast and Cervical*
16 *Cancer Early Detection Program Reauthoriza-*
17 *tion of 2007, and annually thereafter,” and in-*
18 *serting “2 years after the date of enactment of*
19 *the SCREENS for Cancer Act of 2025, and every*
20 *5 years thereafter,”;*

21 *(B) by striking “Labor and Human Re-*
22 *sources” and inserting “Health, Education,*
23 *Labor, and Pensions”; and*

24 *(C) by striking “preceding fiscal year” and*
25 *inserting “preceding 2 fiscal years in the case of*

1 *the first report after the date of enactment of the*
2 *SCREENS for Cancer Act of 2025, and pre-*
3 *ceding 5 fiscal years for each report thereafter,”;*
4 *and*

5 *(4) in section 1510(a) (42 U.S.C. 300n–5(a))—*

6 *(A) by striking “2011, and” and inserting*
7 *“2011,”; and*

8 *(B) by inserting “, and \$235,500,000 for*
9 *each of fiscal years 2026 through 2030” before*
10 *the period at the end.*

11 *(b) GAO STUDY.—Not later than September 30, 2027,*
12 *the Comptroller General of the United States shall report*
13 *to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pen-*
14 *sions of the Senate and the Committee on Energy and Com-*
15 *merce of the House of Representatives on the work of the*
16 *National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Pro-*
17 *gram, including—*

18 *(1) an estimate of the number of individuals eli-*
19 *gible for services provided under such program;*

20 *(2) a summary of trends in the number of indi-*
21 *viduals served through such program; and*

22 *(3) an assessment of any factors that may be*
23 *driving the trends identified under paragraph (2), in-*
24 *cluding any barriers to accessing breast and cervical*
25 *cancer screenings provided by such program.*
