A BILL

To require the Secretary of Agriculture to submit an annual report to Congress on the state of food security and diet quality in the United States, including the impact of changes to the supplemental nutrition assistance program (SNAP), and to provide policy recommendations for improving nutrition outcomes for both participants and nonparticipants.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “SNAP Study Act of
5 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. FOOD SECURITY AND DIET QUALITY REPORT.**

2 The Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. 2011
3 et seq.), as amended by section 4125, is amended by add-
4 ing at the end the following:

5 **“SEC. 32. FOOD SECURITY AND DIET QUALITY REPORT.**

6 “(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
7 effective date of this section, and annually thereafter, the
8 Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Agriculture,
9 Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate and the Committee
10 on Agriculture of the House of Representatives a report
11 on food security and diet quality in the United States.

12 “(b) CONTENTS.—The report required to be sub-
13 mitted under subsection (a) shall include—

14 “(1) an analysis of the food security and diet
15 quality of participants and nonparticipants in the
16 supplemental nutrition assistance program;

17 “(2)(A) a summary of legislative and Executive
18 branch changes made to the supplemental nutrition
19 assistance program in the year covered by the report
20 that are intended to improve food security and diet
21 quality; and

22 “(B) an analysis of the impact and effectiveness
23 of those changes on food security and diet quality;
24 and

25 “(3) recommendations to the Congress on how
26 to improve food security and diet quality for partici-

1 pants and nonparticipants in the supplemental nutri-
2 tion assistance program.”.

3 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

4 This Act and the amendment made by this Act shall
5 take effect 180 days after the date of the enactment of
6 this Act.
