AN ACT

To require the Secretary of State to revoke any United States passport issued to an individual, on receipt of a certification by the Secretary of Health and Human Services that the individual has a child support arrearage exceeding \$2,500.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Ensuring Children Re-
3 ceive Support Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. REVOCATION OF PASSPORTS ISSUED TO INDIVID-**
5 **UALS WITH A CHILD SUPPORT ARREARAGE**
6 **EXCEEDING \$2,500.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 452(k) of the Social Secu-
8 rity Act (42 U.S.C. 652(k)) is amended—

9 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking “, revocation,
10 or limitation” and inserting “or revocation”; and

11 (2) in paragraph (2)—

12 (A) by striking “may revoke, restrict, or
13 limit” and inserting “revoke”; and

14 (B) by inserting “, and notify such indi-
15 vidual of the intent to take such action” before
16 the period.

17 (b) EXCEPTION.—Notwithstanding the amendments
18 made by subsection (a), if an individual is abroad and
19 needs to return to the United States on an emergency
20 basis, the Department of State is authorized to issue a
21 temporary passport for that purpose. That passport will
22 be good only for the return to the United States of the
23 individuals and will be limited in duration.

1 **SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 The amendments made by this Act shall take effect
3 on October 1, 2026.
