A BILL

To amend the Clean Air Act to exclude a portable fuel container from the definition of a consumer or commercial product, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Freedom to Fuel Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. PORTABLE FUEL CONTAINER EXCLUSION.**

6 Section 183(e)(1)(B) of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C.
7 7511b(e)(1)(B)) is amended—

8 (1) in the first sentence, by striking “The
9 term” and inserting the following:

1 “(i) IN GENERAL.—The term”; and
2 (2) by striking the second sentence and insert-
3 ing the following:

4 “(ii) EXCLUSIONS.—The term ‘con-
5 sumer or commercial product’ does not in-
6 clude the following:

7 “(I) A portable fuel container.

8 “(II) A fuel or fuel additive regu-
9 lated under section 211.

10 “(III) A motor vehicle, non-road
11 vehicle, or non-road engine as defined
12 under section 216.”.
