A BILL

To amend the CALM Act to establish requirements for video programming delivered using internet protocol, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Turn It Down Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY OF CALM ACT TO VIDEO PROGRAM-**
6 **MING DELIVERED USING INTERNET PRO-**
7 **TOCOL.**

8 The CALM Act (47 U.S.C. 621) is amended by add-
9 ing at the end the following:

1 **“SEC. 3. APPLICABILITY TO VIDEO PROGRAMMING DELIV-**
2 **ERED USING INTERNET PROTOCOL.**

3 “(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 18 months after
4 the date of the enactment of this section, the Federal
5 Communications Commission shall prescribe pursuant to
6 the Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 151 et seq.)
7 a regulation to ensure that commercial advertisements
8 that accompany video programming delivered using inter-
9 net protocol are subject to volume requirements that are
10 substantially equivalent to the requirements applicable,
11 pursuant to section 2, to commercial advertisements trans-
12 mitted by a television broadcast station, cable operator,
13 or other multichannel video programming distributor.

14 “(b) VIDEO PROGRAMMING DEFINED.—In this sec-
15 tion, the term ‘video programming’—

16 “(1) means programming provided by, or gen-
17 erally considered comparable to programming pro-
18 vided by, a television broadcast station; and

19 “(2) does not include consumer-generated
20 media.”.
