A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to provide special rules for the time period for complying court orders or warrants to disclose information for certain providers, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Evergreen Community
5 Safety Act of 2026”.

1 **SEC. 2. TIME PERIOD FOR COMPLYING WITH A COURT**
2 **ORDER OR WARRANT FOR CERTAIN PRO-**
3 **VIDERS.**

4 Section 2703 of title 18, United States Code, is
5 amended by adding at the end the following:

6 “(i) SPECIAL RULES FOR COVERED PROVIDERS.—

7 “(1) IN GENERAL.—A warrant or a court order
8 for disclosure issued under this section shall require
9 that a covered provider disclose the contents of a
10 wire or electronic communication, or the records or
11 other information sought not later than 72 hours
12 after the issuance of the warrant or court order.

13 “(2) EXTENSION.—A court may extend the
14 time period under paragraph (1) by periods of not
15 more than 7 days if the information sought is volu-
16 minous or complex.

17 “(3) MOTIONS TO QUASH OR MODIFY.—The
18 time period for a covered provider to file a motion
19 under subsection (g)(2) is 48 hours.

20 “(4) CIVIL ACTION.—Notwithstanding any
21 other provision of law, including subsection (e), an
22 individual who is harmed by the failure of a covered
23 provider to comply with a warrant or court order for
24 disclosure in the time period provided by the court
25 may bring a civil action in an appropriate district

1 court of the United States seeking injunctive relief
2 and damages.

3 “(5) DEFINITION.—The term ‘covered provider’
4 means a provider of electronic communication serv-
5 ice or remote computing service that has 1,000,000
6 or more users, subscribers, or customers.”.

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
