Mr. WILSON of South Carolina (for himself and Mr. COHEN) introduced the
following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

A BILL

To require a report on Russian and Chinese intelligence
assets in Georgia, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Countering China’s
5 Control of the Caucasus Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORTS AND BRIEFINGS.**

7 (a) REPORT ON RUSSIAN AND CHINESE INTEL-
8 LIGENCE ASSETS IN GEORGIA.—

9 (1) DEFINED TERM.—In this section, the term
10 “relevant congressional committees” means—

1 (A) the Committee on Foreign Relations of
2 the Senate;

3 (B) the Select Committee on Intelligence
4 of the Senate;

5 (C) the Committee on Armed Services of
6 the Senate;

7 (D) the Committee on Foreign Affairs of
8 the House of Representatives;

9 (E) the Permanent Select Committee on
10 Intelligence of the House of Representatives;
11 and

12 (F) the Committee on Armed Services of
13 the House of Representatives.

14 (2) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
15 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
16 retary of State, in coordination with the Director of
17 National Intelligence and the Secretary of Defense,
18 shall submit a classified report, as appropriate, to
19 the relevant congressional committees that meets the
20 requirements set forth in paragraph (3).

21 (3) CONTENTS.—The report required under
22 paragraph (2) shall—

23 (A) be prepared consistent with the protec-
24 tion of sources and methods;

1 (B) examine the penetration of Russian
2 and Chinese intelligence elements and their as-
3 sets in Georgia; and

4 (C) examine the potential intersection of
5 Russian and Chinese influence and cooperation
6 in Georgia.

7 (b) 5-YEAR UNITED STATES STRATEGY FOR BILAT-
8 ERAL RELATIONS WITH GEORGIA.—

9 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days
10 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec-
11 retary of State shall submit to the relevant congres-
12 sional committees a detailed strategy that—

13 (A) outlines specific objectives for enhanc-
14 ing bilateral ties which reflect the current do-
15 mestic political environment in Georgia;

16 (B) includes a determination of the tools,
17 resources, and funding that should be available
18 to achieve the objectives outlined pursuant to
19 subparagraph (A) and an assessment of wheth-
20 er Georgia should remain a top recipient of
21 United States funding in the Europe and Eur-
22 asia region;

23 (C) includes a determination of the extent
24 to which the United States should continue to
25 invest in its partnership with Georgia; and

1 (D) includes a determination of whether
2 the Government of Georgia remains committed
3 to expanding trade ties with the United States
4 and Europe and whether the United States
5 Government should continue to invest in Geor-
6 gian projects.

7 (2) FORM.—The report required under para-
8 graph (1) shall be submitted in unclassified form,
9 with a classified annex.

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
