A BILL

To amend title 10, United States Code, to include installations of the Coast Guard in the defense community infrastructure program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defense Community
5 Infrastructure Program Revisions Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXPANSION OF DEFENSE COMMUNITY INFRA-**
2 **STRUCTURE PILOT PROGRAM TO INCLUDE**
3 **INSTALLATIONS OF THE COAST GUARD.**

4 Section 2391 of title 10, United States Code, is
5 amended—

6 (1) in subsection (d)—

7 (A) in paragraph (1)(B), in the matter
8 preceding clause (i), by inserting “, and with
9 respect to Coast Guard-related projects, the
10 Secretary, with the concurrence of the Com-
11 mandant of the Coast Guard,” after “The Sec-
12 retary”; and

13 (B) by adding at the end the following new
14 paragraph:

15 “(5)(A) In considering grants, agreements, or other
16 funding under paragraph (1)(A) with respect to commu-
17 nity infrastructure supportive of a military installation of
18 the Coast Guard, the Secretary of Defense shall seek the
19 concurrence of the Commandant of the Coast Guard with
20 respect to assessing the selection and prioritization of the
21 project concerned.

22 “(B) A grant made under this section shall be avail-
23 able to support any Coast Guard mission authorized under
24 section 888 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6
25 U.S.C. 468).”; and

1 (2) in subsection (e)(1), by adding at the end
2 the following new sentence: “For purposes of sub-
3 section (d), the term ‘military installation’ includes
4 an installation of the Coast Guard under the juris-
5 diction of the Department of Homeland Security.”.

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
