Mr. FULLER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Financial Services

A BILL

To award a Congressional Gold Medal to President Donald John Trump, to the United States Secret Service, and to its local law enforcement partners, in recognition of their dedication to protecting our constitutional republican form of government.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Congressional Gold
5 Medal For Inspiring Great Heroism and Tenacity
6 (FIGHT) Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

2 Congress finds the following:

3 (1) Recent actions by President Trump, the Se-
4 cret Service, and local law enforcement partners em-
5 phasize bravery, sacrifice, and an unwavering com-
6 mitment to the safety and stability of the United
7 States.

8 (2) On July 13, 2024, during a peaceful rally
9 in Butler, Pennsylvania, President Trump was shot
10 by a gunman who fired multiple rounds toward the
11 stage which in addition wounded rally attendees and
12 took the life of Corey Comperatore who died shield-
13 ing his family from gunfire.

14 (3) On September 15, 2024, a second assas-
15 sination attempt was thwarted in West Palm Beach,
16 Florida. The vigilant advance work and rapid re-
17 sponse of the United States Secret Service identified
18 a concealed gunman armed with a scoped rifle. Im-
19 mediate proactive engagement by Secret Service
20 agents prevented the assailant from establishing a
21 line of sight on President Trump, ensuring his safe-
22 ty and leading to the swift apprehension of the sus-
23 pect by local law enforcement.

24 (4) On April 25, 2026, an act of political vio-
25 lence was prevented during the White House Cor-
26 respondents' Association Dinner at the Washington

1 Hilton in Washington, DC. An assailant armed with
2 a shotgun, a handgun, and multiple knives charged
3 the security checkpoint outside the event ballroom.
4 United States Secret Service agents fearlessly inter-
5 cepted the threat. Simultaneously, protective details
6 swarmed the ballroom stage to shield President
7 Trump, executing a rapid and secure evacuation
8 amid chaos.

9 (5) These incidents reflect a concerning esca-
10 lation in violent political rhetoric that seeks to un-
11 dermine the democratic process by inciting hostility,
12 division, and physical violence against political lead-
13 ers. This reckless rhetoric created a dangerous envi-
14 ronment that directly contributed to the acts of ter-
15 ror witnessed in Pennsylvania, Florida, and Wash-
16 ington, DC.

17 (6) Showing steadfast resolve in the wake of
18 these violent incidents, President Trump has dem-
19 onstrated bravery and fortitude, refusing to waver or
20 neglect his duties. His unwillingness to bend to those
21 who would do him and our nation harm provides
22 vital reassurance to the American people.

23 (7) The agents assigned to the Secret Service
24 Presidential Protective Division put their lives on
25 the line, protecting the President every day. The

1 courage, rapid reflexes, and dedication displayed by
2 these agents exemplify the highest traditions of law
3 enforcement.

4 (8) Local law enforcement officers and first re-
5 sponders serve as an essential and integral part of
6 the Presidential protection mission. By securing pe-
7 rimeters, managing massive crowds, providing spe-
8 cialized tactical support, executing rapid emergency
9 medical responses, and aiding in the swift apprehen-
10 sion of violent suspects, State and local police forces
11 act as vital force multipliers without which the safe
12 movement and protection of the President would be
13 impossible.

14 (9) The example set by President Trump and
15 the daily resolve shown by the United States Secret
16 Service and its local law enforcement partners serve
17 to reassure the American people that our nation is
18 and will remain strong.

19 **SEC. 3. CONGRESSIONAL GOLD MEDAL.**

20 (a) AWARD AUTHORIZED.—The Speaker of the
21 House of Representatives and the President pro tempore
22 of the Senate shall make appropriate arrangements for the
23 award, on behalf of Congress, of 3 gold medals of appro-
24 priate design to each of President Donald John Trump;

1 the United States Secret Service; and its local law enforce-
2 ment partners, of which—

3 (1) 1 shall be presented to President Donald
4 John Trump for public display as he sees appro-
5 priate;

6 (2) 1 shall be presented to the United States
7 Secret Service for display in the United States Se-
8 cret Service Museum; and

9 (3) 1 shall be presented to local law enforce-
10 ment partners of the United States Secret Service
11 for display at the National Law Enforcement Mu-
12 seum.

13 **SEC. 4. DESIGN AND STRIKING.**

14 (a) IN GENERAL.—For purposes of the award de-
15 scribed in section 3, the Secretary of the Treasury (in this
16 Act referred to as the “Secretary”) shall strike a gold
17 medal with suitable emblems, devices, and inscriptions, to
18 be determined by the Secretary.

19 (b) AUTHORITY TO STRIKE DUPLICATE MEDALS.—
20 The Secretary may strike and sell duplicates in bronze of
21 the gold medal struck pursuant to subsection (a), at a
22 price sufficient to cover the costs thereof, including labor,
23 materials, dies, use of machinery, and overhead expenses.

1 **SEC. 5. STATUS OF MEDALS.**

2 (a) NATIONAL MEDALS.—Medals struck under this
3 Act are national medals for purposes of chapter 51 of title
4 31, United States Code.

5 (b) NUMISMATIC ITEMS.—For purposes of sections
6 5134 and 5136 of title 31, United States Code, all medals
7 struck under this Act shall be considered to be numismatic
8 items.

9 **SEC. 6. AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS; PROCEEDS OF**
10 **SALE.**

11 (a) AUTHORITY TO USE FUND AMOUNTS.—There is
12 authorized to be charged against the United States Mint
13 Public Enterprise Fund such amounts as may be nec-
14 essary to pay for the costs of the medals struck under
15 this Act.

16 (b) PROCEEDS OF SALE.—Amounts received from the
17 sale of duplicate bronze medals authorized under section
18 4 shall be deposited into the United States Mint Public
19 Enterprise Fund. There is authorized to be charged
20 against the United States Mint Public Enterprise Fund
21 such amounts as may be necessary to pay for the costs
22 of the medals struck under this Act.

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
