A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to waive immunity for certain acts committed by Federal law enforcement officers.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Special Immunity
5 for Violating Our State Laws Act of 2026”.

1 **SEC. 2. WAIVER OF IMMUNITY FOR CERTAIN ACTS COM-**
2 **MITTED BY FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT**
3 **OFFICERS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 211 of title 18, United
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
6 lowing:

7 **“§ 3245. Jurisdiction of State over offenses committed**
8 **by Federal law enforcement officers**

9 “Any person who, while engaged in the performance
10 of duties pertaining to the enforcement of the immigration
11 laws (as defined in section 101 of the Immigration and
12 Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101)), commits any act that
13 causes the death of, or serious bodily injury to, any other
14 person, is not immune from prosecution under the law of
15 a State.”.

16 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
17 for chapter 211 of title 18, United States Code, is amend-
18 ed by adding at the end the following:

“3245. Jurisdiction of State over offenses committed by Federal law enforce-
ment officers.”.

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
