To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to provide for a gender identity content descriptor for video programming, and for other purposes.

Mr. MOORE of Alabama introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

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## A BILL

To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to provide for a gender identity content descriptor for video programming, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. GENDER IDENTITY CONTENT DESCRIPTOR FOR**  
4       **VIDEO PROGRAMMING.**

5       Title VII of the Communications Act of 1934 (47  
6       U.S.C. 601 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the  
7       following:

1 **“SEC. 723. GENDER IDENTITY CONTENT DESCRIPTOR FOR**  
2 **VIDEO PROGRAMMING.**

3 “(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the  
4 date of the enactment of this section, the Commission  
5 shall—

6 “(1) determine if the conditions of subsection  
7 (b) have been met; and

8 “(2) if the Commission determines under para-  
9 graph (1) that such conditions have not been met,  
10 promulgate regulations that—

11 “(A) establish a content descriptor for  
12 video programming that depicts, discusses, or  
13 promotes gender identity, gender transition,  
14 transgender identity, or non-binary identity;  
15 and

16 “(B) require distributors of video program-  
17 ming to transmit the content descriptor de-  
18 scribed in subparagraph (A)—

19 “(i) with any video programming  
20 that—

21 “(I) contains the content de-  
22 scribed in such subparagraph; and

23 “(II) is marketed to children  
24 (such as programming that is rated  
25 TV-Y, TV-Y7, or TV-G under the  
26 TV Parental Guidelines); and

1 “(ii) in a manner that, to the max-  
2 imum extent technically feasible, can be  
3 used with the feature described in section  
4 303(x) (commonly known as the ‘V-chip’)  
5 and other parental-control technologies.

6 “(b) VOLUNTARY COMPLIANCE.—The conditions of  
7 this subsection are the following:

8 “(1) The TV Parental Guidelines have been re-  
9 vised so as to include a content descriptor for video  
10 programming that depicts, discusses, or promotes  
11 gender identity, gender transition, transgender iden-  
12 tity, or non-binary identity.

13 “(2) The content descriptor described in para-  
14 graph (1) is being consistently transmitted with the  
15 rating under the TV Parental Guidelines for video  
16 programming that—

17 “(A) contains content described in such  
18 paragraph; and

19 “(B) is rated TV-Y, TV-Y7, or TV-G  
20 under the TV Parental Guidelines or is other-  
21 wise marketed to children.

22 “(c) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-  
23 tion may be construed to ban or censor any video program-  
24 ming.

1       “(d) TV PARENTAL GUIDELINES DEFINED.—In this  
2 section, the term ‘TV Parental Guidelines’ means the vol-  
3 untary ratings (or any successor to such ratings) for video  
4 programming maintained by the TV Parental Guidelines  
5 Monitoring Board (or any successor to such Board).”.
