Ms. STEVENS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Foreign Affairs

A BILL

To require the United States International Trade Commission to investigate national security concerns regarding the exportation of aluminum scrap to countries of concern, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Secure Aluminum Sup-
5 ply Chains Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INVESTIGATION OF NATIONAL AND ECONOMIC SE-**
2 **CURITY RISKS.**

3 (a) **REPORT REQUIRED.**—Not later than 180 days
4 after the date of the enactment of this Act, the United
5 States International Trade Commission shall submit to
6 Congress a report that includes—

7 (1) the results of a review of the national and
8 economic security risks posed by—

9 (A) United States exports of aluminum
10 scrap to countries of concern; and

11 (B) United States aluminum scrap other-
12 wise available to entities organized under the
13 laws of or otherwise subject to the control of a
14 country of concern (including subsidiaries of
15 such entities), whether or not exported directly
16 to the countries of concern; and

17 (2) recommendations on how Congress and the
18 President can address any national or economic se-
19 curity risks identified in the report.

20 (b) **CONSULTATION REQUIRED.**—In conducting the
21 review described in subsection (a)(1), the Commission
22 shall consult as appropriate with stakeholders in the alu-
23 minum scrap and export industries, such as—

24 (1) private entities engaged in aluminum pro-
25 duction in the United States;

1 (2) private entities in the metals recycling in-
2 dustry; and

3 (3) labor organizations involved in aluminum
4 production in the United States.

5 (c) DEFINITIONS.—For purposes of the report re-
6 quired by subsection (a)—

7 (1) the term “aluminum scrap” means recycled
8 or discarded materials primarily containing or de-
9 rived from aluminum; and

10 (2) the term “country of concern” means the
11 Russian Federation, the People’s Republic of China,
12 the Islamic Republic of Iran, and the Democratic
13 People’s Republic of Korea.

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
