A BILL

To improve travel for active-duty military personnel and
accompanying family, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Improving Travel for*
 5 *Military Members Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. IMPROVING TRAVEL FOR ACTIVE-DUTY MILITARY**
 7 **PERSONNEL AND ACCOMPANYING FAMILY.**

8 *(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 60 days after the*
 9 *date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the*
 10 *Transportation Security Administration (in this section re-*
 11 *ferred to as the “Administrator”) may establish a pilot pro-*
 12 *gram at airports to expedite access to security screening for*
 13 *traveling active-duty military personnel and accompanying*
 14 *family members to support and facilitate the ease of travel*
 15 *for such personnel and family members. The Administrator*
 16 *may carry out this subsection only to the extent such access*
 17 *does not compromise security protocols.*

18 *(b) SECURITY REQUIREMENTS.—If the Administrator*
 19 *establishes the pilot program under subsection (a), the Ad-*
 20 *ministrator shall carry out the following:*

21 *(1) Ensure each passenger described in such sub-*
 22 *section is screened in accordance with the vetting sta-*
 23 *tus of such passenger under the Secure Flight pro-*
 24 *gram of the Transportation Security Administration,*

1 *in accordance with paragraph (2) of section 44903(j)*
2 *of title 49, United States Code.*

3 *(2) Prevent individuals carrying out screening*
4 *functions under section 44901 of such title from al-*
5 *lowing any passenger into a TSA PreCheck or other*
6 *expedited security screening lane unless such pas-*
7 *senger has received a boarding pass indicating eligi-*
8 *bility for TSA PreCheck or such other expedited secu-*
9 *rity screening.*

10 *(3) Permit local Administration management to*
11 *open or close checkpoint lanes and reallocate available*
12 *resources as needed to maximize security effectiveness*
13 *and efficiency based on passenger volume.*

14 *(c) SELECTION OF AIRPORTS.—If the Administrator*
15 *establishes the pilot program under subsection (a), in select-*
16 *ing airports for such pilot program, the Administrator*
17 *shall—*

18 *(1) give priority to an airport that is not more*
19 *than a certain distance, as determined by the Admin-*
20 *istrator, from a military installation (as such term is*
21 *defined in section 2801 of title 10, United States*
22 *Code) to which not fewer than a certain number, as*
23 *determined by the Administrator, of active-duty mili-*
24 *tary personnel are stationed;*

1 (2) *consider airports with adequate space to ac-*
2 *commodate dedicated screening lanes for traveling ac-*
3 *tive-duty military personnel and accompanying fam-*
4 *ily members; and*

5 (3) *use any other consideration the Adminis-*
6 *trator determines necessary.*

7 (d) *BRIEFING.—If the Administrator establishes the*
8 *pilot program under subsection (a), not later than nine*
9 *months after such establishment, the Administrator shall*
10 *provide to the Committee on Homeland Security of the*
11 *House of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland*
12 *Security and Governmental Affairs and the Committee on*
13 *Commerce, Science, and Transportation of the Senate a*
14 *briefing on such pilot program.*

15 (e) *SUNSET.—If the Administrator establishes the pilot*
16 *program under subsection (a), the Administrator shall*
17 *carry out such pilot program for a period of three years.*

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
