A BILL

To require the Secretary of Defense to assess the use of intergovernmental support agreements to carry out unspecified minor military construction projects, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Streamlining Military
5 Infrastructure Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ASSESSMENT OF THE USE OF INTERGOVERN-**
2 **MENTAL SUPPORT AGREEMENTS FOR UN-**
3 **SPECIFIED MINOR MILITARY CONSTRUCTION**
4 **PROJECTS.**

5 (a) **REPORT REQUIRED.**—Not later than 120 days
6 after the date of the enactment of this section, each cov-
7 ered Assistant Secretary shall submit to the congressional
8 defense committees a report assessing the potential use
9 of intergovernmental support agreements (as defined in
10 section 2679 title 10, United States Code) to carry out
11 unspecified minor military construction projects under
12 section 2805 of title 10, United States Code.

13 (b) **ELEMENTS.**—The report required under sub-
14 section (a) shall include the following:

15 (1) An assessment of the feasibility of applying
16 revised maximum dollar thresholds for unspecified
17 minor military construction projects carried out
18 under intergovernmental support agreements as fol-
19 lows:

20 (A) \$18,000,000 for laboratory revitaliza-
21 tion projects; and

22 (B) \$8,000,000 for projects carried out
23 using amounts from the Operation and Mainte-
24 nance account.

25 (2) A list of not more than 10 projects included
26 in a facilities investment plan or facility support pro-

1 gram of a military department that could be carried
2 out under intergovernmental support agreements.

3 (c) COVERED ASSISTANT SECRETARY DEFINED.—In
4 this section, the term “covered Assistant Secretary”
5 means—

6 (1) the Assistant Secretary of the Army for In-
7 stallations, Energy, and Environment;

8 (2) the Assistant Secretary of the Navy for En-
9 ergy, Installations, and Environment; and

10 (3) the Assistant Secretary of the Air Force for
11 Installations, Environment, and Energy.

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
