Mr. HARIDOPOLOS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Workforce

A BILL

To enable the Department of Labor to promote the necessity of artificial intelligence to safeguard the welfare and job security of apprentices.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “LEARN AI Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. PROMOTION OF ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE IN AP-**
6 **PRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS.**

7 (a) SENSE OF CONGRESS.—It is the sense of Con-
8 gress that it should be the policy of the United States to
9 promote workforce readiness for the adoption and use of

1 artificial intelligence technologies through registered ap-
2 prenticeship programs.

3 (b) DEPARTMENT OF LABOR ACTIVITIES.—The Sec-
4 retary of Labor may—

5 (1) encourage the inclusion of instruction relat-
6 ing to artificial intelligence technologies, tools, and
7 applications in registered apprenticeship programs;

8 (2) develop and disseminate best practices for
9 the responsible use of artificial intelligence in reg-
10 istered apprenticeship programs;

11 (3) provide technical assistance to employers,
12 labor organizations, educational institutions, and ap-
13 prenticeship sponsors seeking to incorporate artifi-
14 cial intelligence-related competencies into registered
15 apprenticeship programs; and

16 (4) support all efforts related to registered ap-
17 prenticeship programs carried out by the Depart-
18 ment of Labor to prepare workers to adapt to tech-
19 nological changes associated with the use of artificial
20 intelligence.

21 (c) CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this section shall be
22 construed to require any registered apprenticeship pro-
23 gram to adopt artificial intelligence-related instruction or
24 to alter existing program standards established under the
25 Act of August 16, 1937 (commonly known as the “Na-

1 tional Apprenticeship Act”; 50 Stat. 664, chapter 663; 29
2 U.S.C. 50 et seq.).

3 (d) REGISTERED APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM DE-
4 FINED.—The term “registered apprenticeship program”
5 means an apprenticeship program registered under the
6 Act of August 16, 1937 (commonly known as the “Na-
7 tional Apprenticeship Act”; 50 Stat. 664, chapter 663; 29
8 U.S.C. 50 et seq.).

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
