Condemning President Donald J. Trump for his disgraceful, despicable, and disrespectful social media post depicting himself as Jesus Christ, diminishing the dignity of the Presidency and bringing disrepute to the office.

Mr. GREEN of Texas submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

RESOLUTION

Condemning President Donald J. Trump for his disgraceful, despicable, and disrespectful social media post depicting himself as Jesus Christ, diminishing the dignity of the Presidency and bringing disrepute to the office.

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This resolution may be cited as the “Original Resolu-
3 tion Condemning President Donald J. Trump for his dis-
4 graceful, despicable, and disrespectful social media post
5 depicting himself as Jesus Christ, diminishing the dignity
6 of the Presidency and bringing disrepute to the office”.

7 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

8 The House of Representatives finds the following:

1 (1) On Sunday, April 12, 2026, Donald J.
2 Trump, President of the United States of America,
3 posted an image generated by artificial intelligence
4 (AI) portraying himself as Jesus Christ.

5 (2) The image depicts Donald J. Trump, Presi-
6 dent of the United States of America, in a white
7 robe, placing his hand, with light radiating from it,
8 upon an individual in a manner consistent with tra-
9 ditional artistic portrayals of Jesus Christ per-
10 forming acts of healing.

11 (3) The image further incorporates lighting ef-
12 fects, including a luminous glow surrounding the fig-
13 ure, along with figures floating in the background
14 and a woman appearing to pray before him, all of
15 which are elements historically used in religious art
16 to signify divinity, holiness, and sacred authority.

17 (4) Public commentary from religious leaders,
18 political figures, and members of the public over-
19 whelmingly described the image as portraying Presi-
20 dent Trump as Jesus Christ or as a “Christ-like fig-
21 ure”.

22 (5) Jesus Christ is the central and sacred fig-
23 ure in Christianity, revered by billions of people
24 around the world as the foundational figure of
25 Christianity.

1 (6) All who hold public trust, especially those
2 who hold the Nation's highest office, bear a height-
3 ened responsibility to uphold respect for the diverse
4 religious beliefs of the American people.

5 (7) The President of the United States of
6 America knew or should have known that acts by the
7 President of the United States of America that
8 trivialize or exploit any religious symbolism for per-
9 sonal or political purposes are inconsistent with the
10 spirit of mutual respect and dignity that underpins
11 a pluralistic society.

12 (8) The President of the United States of
13 America knew or should have known that respect for
14 religions by the President is essential to maintaining
15 unity and mutual understanding among people of all
16 faiths and backgrounds in the United States.

17 (9) The President of the United States of
18 America knew or should have known that the use of
19 religious imagery by the President for self-promotion
20 or personal glorification undermines the sacred na-
21 ture of such symbols and can be deeply offensive to
22 people of faith.

23 (10) The President of the United States of
24 America knew or should have known that the abuse
25 of religious imagery by the President in a manner

1 that may be perceived as irreverent or blasphemous
2 risks fostering division and disrespect among com-
3 munities of faith.

4 (11) The President of the United States of
5 America knew or should have known that this con-
6 duct by the President of the United States dimin-
7 ishes the dignity of the office, brings disrepute to
8 the Presidency, and undermines the respect the
9 Presidential office is intended to command both do-
10 mestically and internationally.

11 (12) The President of the United States of
12 America knew or should have known that such con-
13 duct by the President of the United States sends the
14 wrong message about the values the United States
15 stands for.

16 (13) The President of the United States of
17 America knew or should have known that the use of
18 religious imagery in what is widely perceived as a
19 self-aggrandizing context by the President risks
20 damaging the image and integrity of the Presidency,
21 which should reflect seriousness and respect for the
22 diverse beliefs of the American people.

23 (14) The President of the United States of
24 America knew or should have known that, by por-
25 traying himself as Jesus Christ, he would be per-

1 ceived as not only trivializing the most sacred figure
2 in Christianity but also making a mockery of the
3 faith, thereby inviting ridicule that diminishes the
4 standing of the United States and its people on the
5 world stage.

6 (15) The President of the United States of
7 America knew or should have known that the Presi-
8 dency is an office intended to embody the highest
9 standards of respect, integrity, and seriousness, and
10 conduct such as this undermines those essential
11 qualities and erodes the respect the office is meant
12 to command.

13 **SEC. 3. CONDEMNATION.**

14 *Resolved,*

15 That the House of Representatives condemns Presi-
16 dent Donald J. Trump for his disgraceful, despicable, and
17 disrespectful “Truth Social” post depicting himself as
18 Jesus Christ on April 12, 2026, diminishing the dignity
19 of the Presidency and bringing disrepute to the office.

20 That Donald J. Trump, President of the United
21 States of America, should state publicly that his depicting
22 himself as Jesus Christ was disrespectful and offensive.
