RESOLUTION

Denouncing the attack on a U.S. Border Patrol facility in
McAllen, Texas, on July 7, 2025.

Whereas, on July 7, 2025, Ryan Louis Mosqueda attacked a
U.S. Border Patrol facility located in McAllen, Texas;

Whereas Ryan Louis Mosqueda opened fire, injuring Border
Patrol agents and McAllen police;

Whereas everyone should pray for the quick healing of the
victims of Ryan Louis Mosqueda's attack;

Whereas the Border Patrol agents and personnel are dedicated public servants who work tirelessly to secure our Nation's borders and enforce immigration laws, often operating in dangerous and challenging environments;

Whereas such attacks undermine the rule of law, endanger the lives of Federal agents and local law enforcement, and disrupt critical operations essential to national security and public safety;

Whereas the safety and well-being of all Federal law enforcement officers, including those serving with the U.S. Border Patrol, are paramount and must be protected; and

Whereas the House of Representatives unequivocally supports the men and women of the U.S. Border Patrol and condemns all acts of violence against law enforcement personnel and Federal facilities: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

2 (1) strongly condemns the violent attack on the
3 U.S. Border Patrol facility in McAllen, Texas, on
4 July 7, 2025;

5 (2) expresses its deepest sympathies to per-
6 sonnel injured in the attack, and wishes them a swift
7 and full recovery;

8 (3) reaffirms its unwavering support for the
9 U.S. Border Patrol in their mission to protect the
10 American people and secure our borders; and

11 (4) stands in solidarity with the community of
12 McAllen, Texas.
