A BILL

To amend the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 to include food allergy information in existing training modules for local food service personnel.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting Children
5 with Food Allergies Act of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCLUDING FOOD ALLERGY INFORMATION IN EX-**
 2 **ISTING TRAINING MODULES FOR LOCAL**
 3 **FOOD SERVICE PERSONNEL.**

4 (a) **FOOD ALLERGY TRAINING MODULE.**—Section
 5 7(g)(2)(B)(iii) of the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42
 6 U.S.C. 1776(g)(2)(B)(iii)) is amended—

7 (1) by redesignating subclauses (II) and (III)
 8 as subclauses (III) and (IV), respectively; and

9 (2) by inserting after subclause (I) the fol-
 10 lowing:

11 “(II) food allergies, including in-
 12 formation on the best practices to pre-
 13 vent, recognize, and respond to food-
 14 related allergic reactions;”.

15 (b) **CERTIFICATION.**—Section 7(g)(2)(B)(ii)(II) of
 16 the Child Nutrition Act of 1966 (42 U.S.C.
 17 1776(g)(B)(ii)(II)) is amended by striking “clause (i)”
 18 and inserting “clauses (i) and (iii)”.
