A BILL

To repeal the District of Columbia Incarceration Reduction Amendment Act and Second Look Amendment Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Just Incarceration of
5 Criminal Elements in D.C. Act” or the “JUSTICE in
6 D.C. Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF THE INCARCERATION REDUCTION**
2 **AMENDMENT AND SECOND LOOK AMEND-**
3 **MENT ACTS.**

4 Section 3c of the Act entitled “An Act to establish
5 a Board of Indeterminate Sentence and Parole for the
6 District of Columbia and to determine its functions, and
7 for other purposes”, approved July 15, 1932 (sec. 24-
8 403.03, D.C. Official Code), is amended to read as follows:

9 **“SEC. 3c. GRANTS FOR VICTIMS OF VIOLENT CRIME.**

10 “Beginning in fiscal year 2026, the Office of Victim
11 Services and Justice Grants shall, on an annual basis,
12 issue grants in an amount that is not more than \$200,000
13 per grant per year to organizations that provide services
14 to survivors of violent crimes, including advocacy, mental
15 health, and employment services.”.

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
