A BILL

To require the Comptroller General of the United States to submit reports to Congress on theft of mail and United States Postal Service property, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Upholding a Secure
5 Postal System Act” or the “USPS Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORTS ON MAIL AND POSTAL SERVICE PROP-**
2 **ERTY THEFT.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
4 date of enactment of this Act and each year thereafter
5 for 5 years, the Comptroller General of the United States
6 shall investigate nationwide patterns and instances of
7 theft of mail and United States Postal Service property
8 and submit a report on each such investigation to the
9 Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Af-
10 fairs of the Senate and the Committee on Oversight and
11 Government Reform of the House of Representatives.

12 (b) CONTENTS.—Each report under subsection (a)
13 shall include a description of any measures the Postal
14 Service has in place to address such theft, and rec-
15 ommendations on how the Postal Service and Congress
16 can combat such theft.

17 (c) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out this section, the
18 Comptroller General shall consult with the Inspector Gen-
19 eral of the Postal Service and the United States Postal
20 Inspection Service.

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
