A BILL

To amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to provide for comprehensive student achievement information.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Time for Completion
5 Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. CONSUMER INFORMATION ABOUT COMPLETION OR**
7 **GRADUATION TIMES.**

8 (a) TRANSPARENCY IN COLLEGE TUITION FOR CON-
9 SUMERS.—Subparagraph (J) of section 132(i)(1) of the

1 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1015a(i)(1)(J))
2 is amended to read as follows:

3 “(J)(i) For programs of study 4 years of
4 length or longer—

5 “(I) the percentages of first-time, full-
6 time, degree- or certificate-seeking under-
7 graduate students enrolled at the institu-
8 tion who obtain a degree or certificate
9 within each of the times for completion or
10 graduation described in subclauses (I)
11 through (III) of clause (iii);

12 “(II) the percentages of first-time,
13 part-time, degree- or certificate-seeking un-
14 dergraduate students enrolled at the insti-
15 tution who obtain a degree or certificate
16 within each of the times for completion or
17 graduation described in subclauses (I)
18 through (III) of clause (iii);

19 “(III) the percentages of non-first
20 time, full-time, degree- or certificate-seek-
21 ing undergraduate students enrolled at the
22 institution who obtain a degree or certifi-
23 cate within each of the times for comple-
24 tion or graduation described in subclauses
25 (I) through (III) of clause (iii); and

“(IV) the percentages of non-first-time, part-time, degree- or certificate-seeking undergraduate students enrolled at the institution who obtain a degree or certificate within each of the times for completion or graduation described in subclauses (I) through (III) of clause (iii).

“(ii) For programs of study less than 4 years—

“(I) the percentages of first-time, full-time, degree- or certificate-seeking undergraduate students enrolled at the institution who obtain a degree or certificate within each of the times for completion or graduation described in subclauses (I) through (IV) of clause (iii);

“(II) the percentages of first-time, part-time, degree- or certificate-seeking undergraduate students enrolled at the institution who obtain a degree or certificate within each of the times for completion or graduation described in subclauses (I) through (IV) of clause (iii);

“(III) the percentages of non-first-time, full-time, degree- or certificate-seeking

ing undergraduate students enrolled at the institution who obtain a degree or certificate within each of the times for completion or graduation described in subclauses (I) through (IV) of clause (iii); and

“(IV) the percentages of non-first-time, part-time, degree- or certificate-seeking undergraduate students enrolled at the institution who obtain a degree or certificate within each of the times for completion or graduation described in subclauses (I) through (IV) of clause (iii).

“(iii) For purposes of this subparagraph, the times for completion or graduation are as follows:

“(I) The normal time for completion of, or graduation from, the student’s program.

“(II) 150 percent of the normal time for completion of, or graduation from, the student’s program.

“(III) 200 percent of the normal time for completion of, or graduation from, the student’s program.

1 “(IV) 300 percent of the normal time
 2 for completion of, or graduation from, the
 3 student’s program.

4 “(iv) In making publicly available the per-
 5 centages described in this subparagraph, the
 6 Secretary shall display each percentage in a
 7 consistent manner and with equal visibility.”.

8 (b) INSTITUTIONAL AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IN-
 9 FORMATION FOR STUDENTS.—Section 485(a) of the
 10 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1092(a)) is
 11 amended—

12 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking subparagraph
 13 (L) and inserting the following:

14 “(L) each completion or graduation rate for
 15 each type of student and program described in
 16 clauses (i) and (ii) of section 132(i)(1)(J);” and

17 (2) in the matter preceding subparagraph (A)
 18 of paragraph (3), by striking “within 150 percent of
 19 the normal time for completion of or graduation
 20 from the program” and inserting “within the time
 21 for completion or graduation described in section
 22 132(i)(1)(J) applicable to such student and such
 23 program”.

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
