Mr. PADILLA (for himself, Mr. CURTIS, Mr. BOOZMAN, Mr. CRAPO, Mr. KELLY, Mr. MERKLEY, Mr. SCHIFF, and Mr. SHEEHY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency to modify regulations with respect to drinking water State revolving funds, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Firefighting Infra-
5 structure for Rural and Exurban Smaller Municipalities
6 Augmenting Residential Fuels Treatments Act of 2026”
7 or the “FIRE SMART Act of 2026”.

1 **SEC. 2. REQUIRED REGULATORY REVISIONS.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after the
3 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator of the
4 Environmental Protection Agency (referred to in this sec-
5 tion as the “Administrator”) shall—

6 (1) revise section 35.3505 of title 40, Code of
7 Federal Regulations, to ensure that—

8 (A) the term “community at high risk
9 from fire or wildfire” is defined to mean a com-
10 munity located in an area with a high risk for
11 fire or wildfire, in the built or natural environ-
12 ment, as evidenced by a State wildfire map or
13 a geospatial map generated pursuant to section
14 210(a) of the Wildfire Suppression Funding
15 and Forest Management Activities Act (16
16 U.S.C. 6501 note; division O of Public Law
17 115–141);

18 (B) the terms “rural” and “rural area”
19 have the meaning given those terms in subpara-
20 graph (A) of section 343(a)(13) of the Consoli-
21 dated Farm and Rural Development Act (7
22 U.S.C. 1991(a)(13)), subject to subparagraphs
23 (H) and (I) of that section; and

24 (C) the term “water infrastructure for fire
25 suppression” means improvements to a public
26 water system for purposes that will facilitate

1 compliance with section 1412 of the Safe
2 Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C. 300g–1) or oth-
3 erwise further the public health protection ob-
4 jectives of that Act (42 U.S.C. 300f et seq.)
5 and that aid in fire suppression for the protec-
6 tion of public health, safety, and property from
7 wildfire;

8 (2) revise section 35.3520 of that title—

9 (A) in subsection (b)(2)—

10 (i) in clause (ii) (relating to trans-
11 mission and distribution), to insert “and
12 enhancement of water system delivery and
13 distribution capacity in a rural area to aid
14 in fire suppression in communities at high
15 risk from fire or wildfire” before the period
16 at the end;

17 (ii) in clause (iv) (relating to storage),
18 to insert “and enhancement of water infra-
19 structure for fire suppression in a rural
20 area in communities at high risk from fire
21 or wildfire” before the period at the end;
22 and

23 (iii) in clause (v) (relating to consoli-
24 dation), to insert “or where necessary for
25 enhancing water infrastructure for fire

1 suppression in a rural area in communities
 2 at high risk from fire or wildfire” before
 3 the period at the end; and

4 (B) in subsection (e)(4), to insert “, except
 5 for projects specifically identified in paragraphs
 6 (b)(2)(ii), (b)(2)(iv), and (b)(2)(v) of this sec-
 7 tion that have both drinking water benefits and
 8 fire suppression benefits, for which priority
 9 shall be given to projects in communities that
 10 have adopted a community wildfire protection
 11 plan (as defined in section 101(a) of the
 12 Healthy Forests Restoration Act of 2003 (16
 13 U.S.C. 6511(a))) or have taken proactive meas-
 14 ures to encourage property owners to reduce
 15 fire risk on private property” before the period
 16 at the end;

17 (3) revise section 35.3555(c)(1) of that title to
 18 add at the end the following: “In addition, the pri-
 19 ority system may include projects that improve both
 20 infrastructure for drinking water and water infra-
 21 structure for fire suppression in rural areas in com-
 22 munities at high risk from fire or wildfire.”; and

23 (4) make such purely technical and conforming
 24 revisions to the regulations of the Administrator as

1 are necessary to implement the revisions described in
2 paragraphs (1) through (3).

3 (b) IMMEDIATE EFFECT.—Notwithstanding the pe-
4 riod for revision required under subsection (a), beginning
5 on the date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator
6 shall implement sections 35.3505, 35.3520, and 35.3555
7 of title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, in accordance
8 with the revisions required under that subsection.

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
